Dinner Groups Forming Ringing the Redeemer Dinner Bell

For those at Redeemer with appetite for fun social gathering while dining, we look to re-start congregational "Dinner Group" events that had been on the menu, so to speak, before the pandemic came along. The plan is to form groups between seven and nine (singles and couples are welcome) with each group arranging to meet up sporadically (roughly once every two months) for a breakfast, lunch or dinner, either in potluck style at a group member's home, or at a local eatery where everyone in the group pays their own tab. The DECA group at nearby Marshall High School is hosting an end-of-the-year bake project within their entrepreneurship class. They work with David's Cookie Dough for fundraising. Instead of selling cookies, they will be donating them to the Shelter House (https:// shelterhouse.org/contact_us/) for houseless people that often don't have the privilege of having home baked goods. Each and every dollar donated will go towards the mass order of the cookie dough which is sold in \$18 increments and will then be baked and donated post shipment, which is expected to be next month. They can take cash or checks, which would be made out to Marshall DECA. (They ask for all checks to be in \$18 increments due to school club accounting limitations.) All funds may be dropped in the box in Crossroads labeled "Shelter House cookie dough \$."
