Dear Archdiocesan School Communities:

We have been closely monitoring the COVID-19 virus with guidance from the CDC and the Georgia Department of Public Health. While there are currently no known direct exposures to our school communities, in the greater interest of public health, **our Archdiocesan schools will be closed from March 16, 2020 through March 27, 2020**. Schools are scheduled to re-open on Monday, March 30 subject to review due to this rapidly changing situation.

High Schools will begin virtual school days on Monday, March 16 while our elementary schools will begin Home Learning Plans no later than Wednesday, March 18. Parents and students will receive more information from their principals including the posting of school office hours so that families may retrieve any student items remaining in classrooms or materials needed for participation in our online learning days.

During this time frame, all extracurricular activities, sports, practices, school events and field trips are cancelled.

Please know that the closing of our schools was not an easy decision.

Please stay safe and avoid large public gatherings during the next several weeks.
