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#### TORAH READING

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The High Holiday season officially begins with the commencement of Selichos. There are various customs with regards to the start date of selichos. Sephardim begin the practice at the onset of the month of Elul. Ashkenazim begin the practice of selichos between 4 to 7 days prior to Rosh Hashanah. So what are selichos and why is it important to get up so early to engage in extra prayer?

A bit of history is in order. After the Jewish people sinned with the Golden Calf, Moshe pleaded with G-d on behalf of his flock that they be granted forgiveness. On the first of Elul, Moshe went up the mountain and prayed for 40 days. At the conclusion of the 40 days, G-d declared that he forgave the Jewish people. That day was the tenth of Tishrei and it became our first national day of forgiveness: Yom Kippur. However, just as with the initial Yom Kippur, we can't just show up on the final day and ask for forgiveness. This requires a process of introspection, self reflection and verbal expressions of regret. This is what Selichos is about. It's not about mouthing some alien words that we do not understand nor relate to. It's about understanding our true selves and all of our strengths and shortcomings. In the areas where we can improve, this season encourages us to ponder what action items we can do to make that a reality.

There's a famous story with the Chasidic Rebbe of Kotzk who many students and visitors come from near and far to soak up his wisdom. There was once a visitor who came to him and asked if he could remain and become a student of the Rebbe. "What is it you are looking for?" asked the Rebbe. "I am looking to discover G-d and that is why I came to you". "Well, you came to the wrong place", said the Rebbe. With a puzzled look, the visitor asked, "what does everyone come here for than"? The Rebbe of Kotzk looked at the man and said "people come here to discover themselves". The Slichos season is about self discovery which hopefully will lead to self improvement. I wish everyone a meaningful and uplifting conclusion of Elul.


