Over the course of a person's lifetime, there might be a few events that occur that are so extraordinarily significant and seismic that one most likely will remember precisely where they were located when hearing the news. The events of 9/11 fit the bill. No matter where the individual was, he most likely remembers exactly where he was and what he was doing during the morning of September 11, 2001. There have been approximately 75 million people born in the U.S.A in the last twenty years, and the day will come when 9/11 is no longer a lived experience but just another part of history. The Torah put such a premium to remember or Zachor on the evils that Amalek inflicted upon you because even the greatest atrocities have a way of feeling less important over time. Therefore, as we observe the twentieth anniversary of 9/11, it behooves to keep its lessons relevant.

September 11, 2001, did more than take the precious lives of nearly three thousand innocent souls and destroy the World Trade Center and part of the Pentagon. It also broke the widely held belief the American homeland was somehow immune to acts of terror that routinely occur in other parts of the world. The mighty symbols of the American military and economic powers came to its knees. In the years that followed, a resilient nation regrouped and rebuilt and even took the war on terror to the enemy's backyard. Things started feeling back to normal, or so we hoped. The financial meltdown in 2007-2008 was a shock to America that many will never forget. Prominent financial institutions went bankrupt overnight, and the effect went from Wall Street to Main Street. The economic meltdown exposed the fault lines of a previously imagined unbreakable American economy. The most brutal era of the economy since the Great Depression took no prisoners. The economy finally did return to pre-crisis levels, and America began to party again. The stock market began to reach unimaginable levels, and many thought good times were here to stay.

In the early part of 2020, we first heard about a distant virus in China, and not too many people imagined the possibilities of how an idyllic American society was about to unravel. Unfortunately, it took just a few microscopic pathogens to bring America to its knees. The previously vaunted healthcare infrastructure was put under tremendous strain and exposed to be far weaker when put to the test. These microscopic pathogens grounded a mighty U.S. Naval Aircraft Carrier and dealt a catastrophic blow to the economy. In March 2020, the Dow drop in stock prices was so massive that the New York Stock Exchange suspended trading several times during those days. Over a year and a half later, America is afflicted with the Delta variant, and hospitals in many areas of the country (including Jacksonville) are struggling to cope. To make things worse, the withdrawal from Afghanistan was such a debacle that it left what little prestige America has with its allies evaporating.

In the 20 years since 9/11, America has shrunk in its prestige, power, and influence. In areas from military strength, economic power, and diplomatic credibility, America is sadly a shadow of its past. Meanwhile, dangerous adversaries have strengthened and threatened American interests. This is not a political statement. This decline occurred over two decades with various presidents and governments in power. In Jewish communities around the country, its shuls and schools invest more in security as it realizes how vulnerable and precarious its standing is.

September 11, 2021, is the twentieth anniversary of 9/11. It also coincides with Shabbos Shuva 5782. This is the time of year we realize how fragile our personal and communal standing is in this chaotic world. Let us utilize these auspicious days to return to the Al-Mighty as we pray for the gift of nothing less than life itself.
