MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI

On the final day of a long and rich life. Moshe addresses his flock and stipulates that his message is relevant for all Jews, scholars and students to butchers and bakers and everyone in between. He emphasizes this message is so vital that no one in his generation or future generations should ever lose sight of this. He stresses that this is not just a directive or even a Mitzvah but is a covenant. The meaning of this covenant is that it is permanently binding on all of us all of the time. The covenant's main thrust is communicated at the end of his message with the notion for us to be responsible for one another. This is not an easy value to internalize. In certain instances, It's apparent and obvious that it makes sense to be a citizen brimming with responsibility. In other cases, it's more challenging to be an individual that demonstrates responsibility to one another and the Klal. In the Talmud that we studied this week in the Daf Yomi, there is an interesting philosophical debate if one can violate a minor prohibition to save another person from violating a major prohibition. Just for an individual to consider to violate a minor prohibition to save another person from a major prohibition would

appear to be shocking! Wouldn't that compromise one's own spiritual connection? If someone else is sinning, why should it come at the expense of my connection to Torah and Mitzvos? The reality of what it means to be a member of the covenant gives some clarity to that. If someone practices their mitzvah observance in a silo without care or concern about others' spiritual needs, it is losing sight of what it means to be a connected and observant Jew. In a world of approximately 15 million Jews, there is but a small number of Jews connected to God through the observance of the Torah and Mitzvos. While there is not one thing everyone can do to solve this sad predicament, at the very least, one should be concerned and continue to pray for our nation's spiritual health. In a few short days, we will be gathered in shul and recite the words in our liturgy "Remember Us For Life." We pray for the physical health, emotional health, and spiritual health of our entire nation. This is not just a nice idea or value. This is part of our covenant, and this is why this Parsha is read before we start a new year.
