


# *Dance in the Garden*


SECOND, PICK OTHER COLORS TO ENHANCE YOUR MAIN COLOR. THERE ARE TWO COMMON APPROACHES TO CHOOSING THE “OTHER COLOR” TO YOUR MAIN COLOR. CHOOSING COMPLIMENTARY COLORS -- THOSE FOUND ON THE OPPOSITE SIDE OF THE COLOR WHEEL -- WILL CREATE A COLORFUL, CASUAL LOOK IN YOUR GARDEN. BY CONTRAST, USING ANALOGOUS COLORS, OR THOSE FOUND ON THE SAME SIDE OF THE COLOR WHEEL, WILL YIELD A BOLD SWATH OF COLOR IN YOUR BED.

AND FOR A SOCIALLY DISTANT, OUTDOOR DESTINATION, VISIT YOUR LOCAL NURSERY AT EACH SEASON TO SEE WHAT IS IN BLOOM. THEN SIT BACK, AND ENJOY THE DANCE.
