# **The Offering**

A note about Communion: A word about Holy Communion: We are about to receive the Lord's Supper. Before you receive, you might consider the following questions: Do you believe you are a sinner? Do you believe Jesus Christ died for you and shed his blood for you on the cross for the forgiveness of your sins? Do you believe that in the Lord's Supper he gives you his true body and blood for the forgiveness of all your sins and strengthens your faith in him and your love for others? If you are a baptized Christian and share these Biblical truths, please come! Those who have not yet received instruction may come forward for a blessing, crossing their arms over their chest to indicate they are not receiving the elements.

Communion will be received through intinction this morning. The ushers will release you from the center aisle. After you receive the host, simply move to the chalice and dip the wafer about half way into the wine to receive the bread and the wine together. You may return to your seats by the side aisle.
