Safety Update From Kyle Chang

Foot/Leg Fatigue

When it comes to PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) we immediately think of gloves or masks. We often forget about our feet and legs. Carseat Reminder

With Holiday travel coming up over the next couple of months, we would like to remind you that carseats have restrictions on where they may be placed on an aircraft. In addition to not being able to have the carseat in an aisle seat (unless in the middle section of an A330 and the CDEG seats are occupied by the same traveling party), **"CRS must not be placed in an exit row or FWD/AFT of an exit row"** (IFM Section 12.34.3 page 12-95). If you notice this during boarding, please notify a CSA immediately to have the passengers reseated.



NO "TENT" BUILDING

The Company has been made aware of FAs creating rest areas utilizing the galley curtains by detaching the hooks in which they're attached by. Then using the OHBs directly above the last rows of both A/Cs to hold them in place draping seat sections that are NOT designated/assigned crew rest seats per our contract. The Company views this as a violation of which building "tents" are prohibited, which is subject to discipline, including but not limited to termination. Please refer to 12-33 in your IFM.

The Company's definition of what a "tent" is shall be interpreted as anything created on the A/C that wasn't installed for the purposes of which it was intended, i.e. galley curtains, safety briefing cards, extra comfort seat signs and the like.
