AFA-CWA HISTORY:

1945, FAs at United Airlines organize Airline Stewardess Association (ALSA)

1949, ALSA merges with the Air Line Stewards and Stewardesses Association (ALSSA) affiliate of ALPA

1973, ALSSA FAs chose self-determination and form the independent Association of Flight Attendants, leaving ALPA

1984, AFL-CIO granted AFA a charter

2004, AFA becomes Communications Workers of America (CWA) sector
