- Register to vote
- Update your existing voter registration
- Check your registration status
- Edit or change your information
- Find what your ballot will look like
- Find ballot drop off boxes
- Find voter service centers where you can vote, register, and drop off ballots

You will need your current Hawaii drivers license as well as social security number to begin this process. It is up to us to make a difference and we encourage you to reach out to coworkers, family, and friends to ensure that they are registered to vote.

Next week our focus will shift to education from how to fill out your ballot, ensuring you meet the timeline to mail your ballot, and who will be on your ballot and what that will look like. We will also have options for our members if deadlines aren't met.
