California Wildfires

Update #2

- The California fires continue to impact our community, but we are relieved to report that all flight attendants are safe despite some evacuations.
- Your safety is our top priority—please evacuate immediately if instructed and have a “ready-to-go” bag prepared with essentials.
- Management has assured us they will assist flight attendants in need, and AFA International leadership has expressed their full support for LAX flight attendants and leadership.
- Remember, you are not alone; reach out to AFA or the company for help, and take care of yourselves during this challenging time.

Aloha LAX,

As of our last communication regarding the California fires, a lot has happened. We are happy to report that, although some of our Flight Attendants had to evacuate, everyone is safe as far as we know.

Your safety remains our highest priority. If you are asked to evacuate, please do so immediately. Have a "ready-to-go" bag prepared with essentials, including important documents, medications, a change of clothes, water, non-perishable food, and other necessities.

Please continue to reach out to the company and AFA if you need support. **Management has assured us of their cooperation** in assisting Flight Attendants who require help. Do not hesitate to reach out for any assistance.

Additionally, we have been in contact with AFA International. **Sara Nelson, Dante Harris, and Keturah Johnson have expressed their support** for our Flight Attendants and LAX leadership, and they send their prayers and thoughts during this challenging time.

We want to stress that **you are not alone in this**. Together, we will get through these difficult times. Look out for one another and prioritize your well-being above all else.

Evacuation Facilities:

- **Airbnb**

Airbnb, in collaboration with [211 LA](#), is offering free temporary housing for residents displaced or forced to evacuate due to the devastating wildfires in Los Angeles County.

To qualify for the temporary housing, residents must:

- Have been displaced from your physical home due to the recent fires
- Currently reside in an evacuation zone
- Have an active Airbnb account or be able to create one
- Be 18 years old or older.
