Texas A&M AgriLife Extension will be holding a training for landowners who wish to obtain their Texas Department of Agriculture Pesticide Private Applicator license.

TDA states "A private pesticide applicator is someone who uses or supervises the use of restricted-use or state-limited-use pesticides or regulated herbicides to produce an agricultural commodity on:

- <u>Personally owned property; Rented property; Property owned by his or her employer; Property under his or her general</u> <u>control; or</u>
- <u>The property of another person if applied without compensation, other than the trading of personal services between</u> <u>producers of agricultural commodities.</u>

An agricultural commodity is a plant or animal grown for sale, lease, barter, feed or human consumption and animals raised for farm or ranch work.

No license is required to apply general-use pesticides to produce agricultural commodities."
