

COMAL COUNTY 4-H STAR AWARDS

Receiving an award is contingent upon you submitting a record book to Comal County Record Book Judging
A maximum of three candidates per level will receive an award per year.

Bronze Star Award - Bronze Star Awards will be awarded to 4-H members who submit a complete application, and the following requirements must be met:

1. The member must be in grade 6, 7 or 8 in August of the current 4-H year and must have completed at least two years in 4-H, including the current year.
2. The 4-H member must have completed projects in three different project areas and have participated in one or more activities in at least three of the following areas:
 - (a) Projects and/or Project Exhibits
 - (b) Participation in Leadership Experiences such as Leadership Labs, Texas 4-H Congress, or National Leadership Events such as National 4-H Congress/Conference, and any county, district, or state leadership group 4-H
 - (c) Competitive Events (judging, educational presentation, public speaking, food show, quiz bowls, etc.)
 - (d) Citizenship Activities
 - (e) Camps at the county, district, or state level
 - (f) Promotion (speeches, poster displays, radio, TV, newspapers)
 - (g) Other (includes Exchange Programs, Fundraising, State and National Congress, etc.)
3. The member must have exhibited leadership skills by serving as a 4-H officer or committee member (club or county), and/or as a junior or teen leader in an activity or project with or under the supervision of an adult volunteer leader.
4. The 4-H member must have participated in one or more community service activities.
5. The 4-H member MUST SUBMIT A TEXAS 4-H RECORDBOOK in the year they are to be considered for the award.

Note: *The requirements for projects and activities do not all have to be completed in the current year. They may have been accomplished over the entire period the person has been in the program.*

Silver Star Award - This award is joined with the National Leadership Award, which is sponsored by the American Youth Foundation. It is given to honor extraordinary young people for their character and leadership. The award recognizes youth who strive to be their personal best and make a positive difference in their schools, youth groups, 4-H clubs, and communities. Award recipients will receive a copy of William H. Danforth's classic motivational book, I Dare You! and are eligible to apply for the "I Dare You" scholarship which partially funds the National Leadership Conference.

Candidates must be at least 14 years of age in the current 4-H year, turn in a complete application, and they must meet the same requirements as Gold Star.

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Gold Star Award - The Gold Star Award is the highest county achievement award a 4-H member may receive. Candidates are those who have at least completed, or will be completing their 9th grade school year at the time of application, must turn in a complete application, and the following requirements must be met:

1. The member must have at least completed or be completing their 9th grade school year at the time of application and must have completed at least 3 years in 4-H, including the current year.
 2. The Texas 4-H Gold Star Award can only be awarded once in a member's 4-H career.
 3. The 4-H member must submit an awards program record book in the year he or she is to be considered for the award.
 4. The 4-H member must have completed projects in at least three different project areas, submitted appropriate record forms, and have participated in one or more activities in at least three of the following areas:
 - (a) Projects and/or Project Exhibits
 - (b) Participation in Leadership Experiences such as Leadership Labs, Texas 4-H Congress, or National Leadership Events such as National 4-H Congress/Conference, and any county, district, or state leadership group 4-H
 - (c) Competitive Events (judging, educational presentation, public speaking, food show, quiz bowls, etc.).
 - (d) Citizenship Activities
 - (e) Camps at the county, district, or state level.
 - (f) Promotion (speeches, poster displays, radio, TV, newspapers)
 - (g) Other (includes Exchange Programs, Fundraising, State and National Congress, etc.)
- Note:** *The requirements for projects and activities do not all have to be completed in the current year. They may have been accomplished over the entire period the person has been in the program.*
5. The member must have exhibited leadership skills by serving as a 4-H officer or committee chair (club, county, district, or state), and/or as a junior or teen leader in an activity or project with or under the supervision of an adult volunteer leader.
 6. The 4-H member must have participated in one or more community service activities. Examples include providing leadership to a One Day 4-H project, working with or counseling junior 4-H members; participating in community service projects (individual, group, or club); and motivating other 4-H members through participation in demonstrations, projects and/or exhibits.
 7. The 4-H member MUST SUBMIT A TEXAS 4-H RECORDBOOK in the year they are to be considered for the award.

4-H Leadership Roles
