GUIDELINES

- An entry includes a team of up to four youth in grades 3-12, following the 4-H guidelines. Individuals/teams may come from schools, churches, 4-H, etc.
- There will be eight classes based on the 2025-2026 4-H Consumer Decision Making Contest classes. Each class will have Eight (8) minutes to be judged. There will be time after the completion of judging for coaches to go thru classes with teams. Teams who have won 1st place at the state roundup contest will be allowed to judge for practice and experience but will not be considered for placings.
- For team placings, teams of 4 will have their lowest individual score dropped. Teams of 3 will have all three individual scores count toward their team score. All ties among any placing team or individual will be broken via designated tiebreakers.

There will be no reasons for this contest.

WHAT TO BRING:

- Clipboard, Regular Calculator (Cannot be a scientific calculator or cell phone/smart device)
- Several sharpened pencils with good erasers, Blank paper for taking notes on classes.

Scantrons will be provided. The official scantron will be Universal A #705A-12. Students should know how to use scantrons properly before coming to the contest.
