### **“Time For Another Miracle”** **(The Perfect Time)**

**What Is A Miracle:** According to the Bible, a miracle is an extraordinary event caused by the direct power of God that goes beyond the normal course of nature.

**Supernatural intervention:** Miracles are seen as a direct in-breaking of God's power, interfering with or deviating from the established laws of nature to accomplish a specific purpose.

**Divine purpose:** They are not random acts but have a clear goal, such as:

**Authenticating messengers:** They confirm the divine authority of a messenger, like Moses or Jesus.

**Confirming the message:** They serve as evidence of the truth of God's word.

**Glorifying God:** They display God's power and majesty to both believers and non-believers.

**Evidence of God's power:** They showcase God's might, which is beyond human ability. Examples include the parting of the Red Sea, Jesus calming the storm, and the resurrection of the dead.

**Evoking awe:** The effect of a miracle is to create a sense of wonder and awe in those who witness it, prompting a greater appreciation for God's work.

**Distinction from providence:** The Bible distinguishes miracles from God's providence, which refers to His continuous, ordinary care for the world. A miracle is a distinct, extraordinary event, like a lame person suddenly walking, rather than a gradual recovery or a fortunate coincidence.



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**"God's timing"** means that events unfold according to God's plan and at His perfect time, necessarily according to man's timelines. It involves trusting in God's power, wisdom and patient, and letting go of the need for immediate control over life's circumstances, even when they are difficult or unclear. It suggests that while people may not see the purpose immediately, everything is happening for a greater reason and at the right time for maximum benefit.

**Perfect timing:** God's divine timing is never early or late, but always perfect, bringing about the right outcome at God's perfect moment, even if the wait is a painful one.

**Patience and preparation:** Trusting God's timing encourages patience and discourages rushing or forcing outcomes. It involves preparing to receive what is meant to come, as if preparing to "get on board" when the right mode of transportation arrives.

### Luke 21:19

#### [Amplified Bible](#)

(19) By your [[patient](#)] endurance [[empowered by the Holy Spirit](#)] you will gain your souls.

Jesus is teaching that through enduring faith, believers will receive salvation through His Name. This promise of eternal life found in scriptures like (**Matthew 24:13, Revelation 2:10**). The concept of "gaining" suggests a reward for faithful living in Christ, aligning with the biblical principle that those who remain steadfast in faith will be saved (**Hebrews 10:36-39**)

**Trust and faith:** Our God has a much grander plan that is beyond our human understanding, and that His plan will ultimately bring what is needed at just the right moment. **Hebrews 11:6**

**Growth through waiting:** Delays and/or struggles are sometimes seen as necessary for personal growth, teaching patience, self-control, and other virtues.

**Surrender of control:** It involves surrendering the anxiety of wanting things on a human time schedule and, letting go of the need to be in control of every outcome including the time of The Rapture.



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### (Is The Rapture A Miracle?)

The Rapture is considered a miracle by believers because it involves a divine, supernatural event of believers being caught up to meet **Jesus**, involving a transformation and rescue from danger. It is seen as a miraculous act of God, where **He** will take **His** people to be with **Him** in the air, according to the belief that it is one of God's prophetic events

### 1 Corinthians 15:51-57

#### Amplified Bible

(51) Listen very carefully, I tell you a mystery [a secret truth decreed by God and previously hidden, but now revealed]; we will not all sleep [in death], but we will all be [completely] changed [wondrously transformed],

**We will not all sleep:** "Sleep" is a euphemism for death used in the New Testament, reflecting the temporary nature of death for believers. This phrase indicates that not all Christians will experience physical death before the return of Christ. This concept is consistent with **1 Thessalonians 4:15-17**, where Paul explains that those who are alive at Christ's coming will not precede those who have died. The use of "sleep" emphasizes the hope of resurrection and eternal life.

**but we will all be changed:** The change refers to the transformation of believers' bodies at the resurrection. This transformation is necessary for believers to inherit the kingdom of God, as flesh and blood cannot inherit it (**1 Corinthians 15:50**). This change is described further in **1 Corinthians 15:52**, where it is said to happen "in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye." The transformation is a fulfillment of the promise of new, glorified bodies, as also mentioned in **Philippians 3:21**, where Christ will transform our lowly bodies to be like His glorious body.

#### Amplified Bible

(52) in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at [the sound of] the last trumpet call. For a trumpet will sound, and the dead [who believed in Christ] will be raised imperishable, and we will be [completely] changed [wondrously transformed].

**in an instant:** This phrase emphasizes the suddenness and immediacy of the event being described. The Greek word used here, "**atomos**," (**uncuttable**) suggests something indivisible, highlighting the rapidity of the transformation. This concept of sudden change is consistent with other biblical descriptions of divine intervention. (**1 Thessalonians 4:16-17**). In the Old Testament, trumpets were used to signal important events. The "last trumpet" here is linked to the **eschatological (teachings on the end times)** events described in Revelation (**Revelation 11:15**), marking the final call for the resurrection and transformation of believers.



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### New Living Translation

(53) For our dying bodies must be transformed into bodies that will never die; our mortal bodies must be transformed into immortal bodies.

### Amplified Bible

(53) For this perishable [part of us] must put on the imperishable [nature], and this mortal [part of us that is capable of dying] must put on immortality [which is freedom from death].

### New Living Translation

(54) Then, when our dying bodies have been transformed into bodies that will never die, this Scripture will be fulfilled: “Death is swallowed up in victory.

### Amplified Bible

(55) O DEATH, WHERE IS YOUR VICTORY? O DEATH, WHERE IS YOUR STING?”

**Where, O Death, is your victory?** - This phrase is a triumphant declaration of the defeat of death through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The victory over death is a fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy, particularly **Isaiah 25:8**, which speaks of God swallowing up death forever. This victory is not just a future hope but a present reality for believers, as they are united with Christ in His resurrection.

**Where, O Death, is your sting?** - The "sting" of death refers to the pain and fear associated with it. In the cultural context of the time, death was often personified as a fearsome force. However, through Christ's resurrection, the sting of death is removed, as sin is forgiven and the law is fulfilled in Him. In **Hosea 13:14**, God promises redemption from death. this phrase underscores the complete and final defeat of death, offering believers assurance of eternal life and freedom from the fear of death. The resurrection of Jesus is the first fruits of His victory, a guarantee of the resurrection that all believers will experience.

### Amplified Bible

(56) The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin [by which it brings death] is the law;

**and the power of sin is the law:** The "power of sin" refers to the strength or influence that sin has over individuals, which is magnified by the law. The law, given through Moses, defines sin and makes people aware of their transgressions (**Romans 3:20**). While the law is holy and righteous (**Romans 7:12**), it also highlights human inability to achieve righteousness on their own. The law acts as a mirror, showing people their sinful nature and their need for a Savior.
