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TOUR ITINERARY

Depart USA: Sunday, May 23, 2027

We depart Buffalo or Toronto for our scheduled overnight flight to Warsaw, Poland

Day 1: WARSAW (D) - Monday, May 24, 2027

Our group will be met at the Warsaw airport and transferred to our hotel. You will have the afternoon free at your leisure. This evening join your fellow travelers at a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight: InterContinental Warszawa.

Day 2: WARSAW CULTURAL EXPERIENCE (B) (L)- Tuesday, May 25, 2027

After breakfast we depart with our private guide for a half-day tour of Warsaw city. We will learn the art and craft of Polish cuisine with an informative and entertaining Polish cooking class. Cook classic Polish dishes and learn about the history of Polish cuisine as you're cooking. Sip on complimentary drinks prior to dining on our creations. This evening attend a live Chopin concert in Dean's Palace Warsaw Archdiocese museum located in the Old Town of Warsaw. The concert, featuring the works of Fryderyk Chopin, will be performed by professional pianists, and virtuosos who have played in many countries around the world. Overnight: InterContinental Warszawa.

Day 3: ROYAL CASTLE IN WARSAW (B)- WEDNESDAY, MAY 26, 2027

After Breakfast we depart with our private guide for a half-day tour of the Royal Castle. Lunch is on your own the remainder of the day is free. Overnight: InterContinental Warszawa.

Day 4: CZESTOCHOWA AND ZAKOPANE (B) - THURSDAY, MAY 27, 2027

This morning we depart for Czestochowa and Jasna Gora Monastery. Sitting on the Warta River in southern Poland, Czestochowa is home to the 14th-century Jasna Gora Monastery, which attracts thousands of pilgrims from all over the world each year. The monastery is home to the Black Madonna painting, a shrine to the Virgin Mary that is credited with many miracles, including saving the monastery from an invasion by the Swedes in the 17th century. After our visit to Zakopane will transfer to our overnight for the next two nights. Overnight: Radisson Blu Hotel Zakopane

Day 5: ZAKOPANE AND TATRA MOUNTAINS (B) (D)- FRIDAY, MAY 28, 2027

Zakopane is a town lying at the foot of the Tatra Mountains - the highest mountain range of the Carpathians. Because of the breathtaking landscapes, vicinity of the mountains, and the fascinating culture and tradition of the highlanders, Zakopane became a popular tourist resort years ago. Entrance is included to Jaszczurowka Chapel and Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima and Krzeptowki. Ride the cable railway up to Mt. Gubalowka above the town of Zakopane. Tonight enjoy a Folk Evening, including dinner and entertainment follow by a bonfire. Overnight: Radisson Blu Hotel Zakopane

Day 6: KRAKOW AND DUNAJEC RIVER GORGE - (B) (D) SATURDAY, MAY 29, 2027

This morning admire the stunning scenery of Poland's Dunajec Valley on this day trip to the Dunajec River Gorge. Float down the river on a wooden raft and soak up views of the limestone cliffs from the water. This evening we will enjoy a traditional dinner with Polish Liqueur tasting. Overnight: Hotel Saski Krakow.



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TOUR ITINERARY

Day 7: HISTORIC KRAKOW (B) - Sunday, May 30, 2027

Krakow is one of the most culturally and politically significant cities in Poland. It was the central site of the Nazi General Government during WWII. Both the Historic City Centre and the Jewish District are brimming with cafés, shops, and pubs, and the 10-acre Main Market Square is a medieval feast for the senses. Our guided tour includes entrances to the Wawel Royal Castle, Wawel Royal Cathedral, and St. Mary Church. After tour you have the remainder of the day free. This afternoon participate in a Stained Glass Workshop and Museum with master craftsmen. Overnight: Hotel Saski Krakow.

Day 8: KRAKOW (B) (L) - Monday, May 31, 2027

Start today with a moving tour of the Auschwitz-Birkenau complex, and learn the harrowing truths of the complex. KL Auschwitz was the largest of the German Nazi concentration camps and extermination centers. Over 1.1 million men, women and children lost their lives here. Our lunch today is planned at a local restaurant. After lunch you have the remainder of the day free. Overnight at the Hotel Saski Krakow.

Day 9: KRAKOW AND WIELICZKA SALT MINE (B) (D) - Tuesday, June 1, 2027

Explore the underground world of the Wieliczka Salt Mine. Follow our expert guide through the mine's tunnels and chambers and discover the Chapel of the Blessed Kinga, an exhibition on the history of Poland's salt-mining, figures carved from salt and more. See why this 700-year-old complex has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Upon our return to Krakow, enjoy the remainder of the day to visit the cafes and get some last minute shopping in. Enjoy a farewell dinner as we say goodbye to Poland with fond memories of our beautiful journey. Overnight at the Hotel Saski Krakow.

Day 10: KRAKOW TO BUFFALO (B) - Wednesday, June 2, 2027

This morning we depart our hotel and head to the Krakow Airport for our flight home.
