Friday, September 4, 2026 DEPART THE UNITED STATES

Saturday, September 5, 2026 DUBLIN ARRIVAL

Stop to visit Dublin Castle, which was the seat of power and government for many centuries. See the State Apartments, where many state functions are held in the richly decorated chambers. Motor a short distance to your hotel, check in and enjoy some free time to freshen up before joining your fellow travelers for a welcome drink. After, spend the remainder of the day at leisure for individual pursuits and dining. OVERNIGHT: GIBSON HOTEL, DUBLIN

Sunday, September 6, 2026 WICKLOW MOUNTAINS

Departing Dublin, drive south to see the delightful scenery of the Wicklow Mountains. This mountain range runs north to south across County Wicklow with its highest peak, Lugnaquilla, at 3039 feet. The entire mountain region is frequented, especially on weekends, by Dubliners, for its scenery and outdoor recreation. Continue your drive into Waterford and stop to tour the House of Waterford Crystal. While here, learn about glass blowing, cutting and see one-of-a-kind masterpieces. Following, embark on a leisurely walking tour of Waterford with a local guide. Stroll along Merchant's Quay before passing the Clock Tower, Reginald's Tower, City Hall, Theatre Royal and many other historical places. Transfer to your nearby hotel, check in and settle into your room. In the evening, meet your group for dinner in the hotel restaurant. DINNER & OVERNIGHT: GRANVILLE HOTEL, WATERFORD

Monday, September 7, 2026 BLARNEY CASTLE

This morning, drive into Blarney, where you can climb the battlements of Blarney Castle and kiss the famous "Stone of Eloquence." Then, visit the Blarney Woollen Mills, which has an excellent range of Irish products. You will also have time to browse around the village, charmingly set around a large village green. Continue your travel into Dingle, check into your hotel and enjoy some free time to freshen up before dining in the hotel restaurant with your fellow travelers. DINNER & OVERNIGHT: DINGLE SKELLIG HOTEL, DINGLE

Tuesday, September 8, 2026 DINGLE PENINSULA DRIVE

Today, discover the beauties of the Dingle Peninsula, once described by the National Geographic Traveler as "the most beautiful place on earth." Drive along the south shore of the peninsula for plenty of vistas of heathery mountains, sandy stretches of beach, stunning green landscapes and rocky headlands. Pause at strategic locations to admire the views and take photos. Continue on to Sleat Head at the western tip of the peninsula. This excursion will give you excellent views of mountains and coastline and looking over to the Iveragh Peninsula. Then, journey into Dunquin and stop to visit the Blasket Centre to learn about the Blasket Islands, inhabited until 1953 by hardy families who eked out a living by farming and fishing. Following, head to Murphy's Ice Cream for a private visit with a talk and tasting. Here, you might also like to try the delicious brown bread or caramelized honeycomb flavors. Return to your hotel in Dingle town, where the rest of the day is free for independent exploring and dining. OVERNIGHT: DINGLE SKELLIG HOTEL, DINGLE

Wednesday, September 9, 2026 CLIFFS OF MOHER

Leaving Dingle, travel into Tarbert and take a short ferry ride across the River Shannon Estuary. Next, drive along the coast of scenic County Clare to visit the Cliffs of Moher, one of Ireland's most beloved, natural landmarks. See magical vistas, overlooking the shimmering Atlantic Ocean along with Ireland's Western coastline. Then, continue into Galway and join a local guide for a gentle walking tour of the city. See the medieval city walls, Lynch's Castle and the narrow streets. Transfer to your nearby hotel, check in and enjoy some free time to freshen up before meeting your group for dinner in the hotel restaurant. DINNER & OVERNIGHT: GALWAY BAY HOTEL, GALWAY

Thursday, September 10, 2026 KYLEMORE ABBEY

After breakfast, journey to Kylemore Abbey for a tour of the elegant mansion and church, set beside a tranquil lake. Learn of the tales of tragedy, romance and royal visits. Also, walk through the magical Victorian walled garden. Then, head into Leenane and set off on a short catamaran cruise aboard the "Connemara Lady" through Killary Harbour, Ireland's only fjord. Enjoy the onboard commentary as you admire the views from this narrow inlet, which is surrounded by hills and cliffs. Departing Galway, drive into Belleek and stop to visit the Belleek Pottery Factory to see how skilled craftspeople form and decorate clay to produce delicate porcelain masterpieces. The cliffs drop straight down to the wild Atlantic waves below and you will see marvelous vistas. While here, have a cup of tea and freshly baked scones with your group. Next, head into Ardara to see demonstrations of spinning, weaving and knitting at Triona Designs. Return to your hotel in Donegal and enjoy the balance at leisure. Tonight, you might like to sample the fine local cuisine by trying a nearby venue. OVERNIGHT: MILL PARK HOTEL, DONEGAL

Sunday, September 13, 2026 DERRY SIGHTSEEING

This morning, journey into Derry and join a local guide for a walking tour to see the Guildhall, St. Columb's Cathedral, the Diamond and the 16th century walls. Next, travel to visit the Giant's Causeway, an impressive area of hexagonal columns formed over 60 million years ago by cooling lava, which has given rise to many legends. Continue your drive along the coast to experience one of Ireland's popular scenic routes. Here, you'll see the "Nine Glens of Antrim" which offer wonderful views of mountains, valleys and coastline. Transfer to your hotel in Belfast, check in and settle into your room. In the evening, enjoy dinner in the hotel restaurant with your group. DINNER & OVERNIGHT: EUROPA HOTEL, BELFAST
