Kontakion – Tone 8 / Plagal 4

You descended into the tomb, O
Immortal, You destroyed the power of
death!
In victory You arose, O Christ God,
proclaiming “Rejoice” to the
myrrhbearing women, granting peace
to Your apostles, and bestowing
resurrection on the fallen.

(Hint: It relates to Pentecost...)

- How does it feel to celebrate the Resurrection?
- How can we give glory to God today?

- How do we celebrate the Resurrection with our church family?
- Why is the resurrection important for each of us?
- What can we do to celebrate Pascha?

- How can we celebrate Pascha at home?
- Why do we eat special foods on Pascha?
- How can the joy of Pascha impact our daily activities at school? at home? at church? with friends?

- How can we be like the apostles in the world?
- Why do we say that Jesus is the Light of the world?

- What are some of the special hymns we sing for the Paschal liturgy?
- Why do we begin celebrating Pascha at midnight?
(Hint: We can’t wait, because it’s so special...)

Study guides for different age groups are available to accompany the “This is the Day” handout for Pascha.

Use as many or as few of the questions and discussion topics to help children learn about the feast while discovering how the Orthodox Faith can be a part of their daily life.

Ask open-ended questions which may lead the conversation to reveal their thoughts about God.

As parents, we may not readily have all the answers, but we have the ability to inspire a desire in children to love God, which can benefit them throughout their lives.

In the Weeks Ahead...

There is no fasting from Pascha through Bright Week. Normal Wednesday and Friday fasting returns after St. Thomas Sunday.

Today: Pascha: The Resurrection

Bright Week: Monday through Saturday

Next Sunday: St. Thomas Sunday

40 Days: Ascension

50 Days: Pentecost
