

Overview **BYLAWS REVISIONS**

This document describes the set of proposed changes to the current set of First Parish bylaws (last revised June 7, 2020), to be finalized and proposed for a vote at the Spring 2023 semi-annual meeting. While there are detailed language changes to be reviewed, the overall set of changes can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Align language to reflect 8th Principle diversity and inclusion ideas
- 2. Close gaps between what the bylaws directs us to do and what we do in practice
- 3. Clarify the relationship to committee charters
- 4. Propose composition of Standing Committees
- 5. Redefine some of the specific Board positions

Schedule

There will be a series of meetings throughout the year to review specific sections of the bylaws using this document as a guide. Each meeting will focus on one of the general areas described above, addressing any questions or concerns about the content and specific language and to gather feedback.
