

Term Limits for County Commissioners


SB 438 by Senator Ingoglia/ HB 57 by Rep. Salzman

Eleven Florida counties currently have term limits and every county in Florida has the ability through a citizen initiative or the Board of County Commissioners to enact term limits. SB 438 and HB 57 take away local decision making creating a one size fits all approach. Voters should maintain the freedom to

decide whether or not to impose term limits and what those term limits should be (they may even want to be more restrictive).

Florida doesn't need redundant and unnecessary legislation - vote no on HB 57 and SB 438.
