Saint Francis Xavier School is pleased to offer a half-day summer school program for preschool through 8th-grade students this year! Classes are designed to help students reinforce grade-level skills, and provide enrichment and exploratory opportunities. Classes are designed to allow students to fulfill the summer requirements!*

Academic Program Fees

- **Morning Classes:** 3 Weeks: \$550
- **Lunch and Play:** 3 Weeks: \$140

This program fills quickly, in the event spots remain available, an individual day registration of \$10 will become available on April 1st.

Daily Schedule

8:00-8:10: Drop off

Student drop off at the **Preschool Gate**. Students arriving after 8:10 should enter through the front office.

8:10-12:00: "School Day"

Morning Academic-Based Programs

*3-8 classes are designed to allow students the time and guidance to fulfill the summer requirements. However, students who have not fully completed the assignments will need to finish the remaining work.

30-minute Snack/Recess in Gym

*Snack bar offering pre-packaged snacks will be open daily. We recommend daily small bills so students can practice counting change

12:00: Dismissal

4-8: Students may leave from the front office or preschool gate. PK-3: Students will be dismissed from the preschool gate

12:00-1:00: Optional "Lunch and Play"

Students will have lunch at The Hungry Wold Cafe or bring their lunch box and some recess time. Students will be dismissed at 1 pm through the gym.

Morning Camp Classes:

If your child is entering Preschool... "Practically Perfect Preschool Readiness"

An introduction to preschool class taught by Mr. Sheedy and Ms. Ilda focusing on listening, following directions and social skills. We will be planning a variety of activities that will be dedicated to these skills as well as letter and number recognition. We will provide many opportunities for hands-on work, learning through play, and moving with purpose. We will have a "Beach Day" theme throughout the program and many activities and crafts will fall in line with this theme.

If your child is entering Kindergarten..."Get Ready for Kindergarten!"

Students will get a sneak peek at the upcoming year! They will explore the kindergarten world of letters and sounds, rhymes, the alphabet, counting and more! Shift into gear with a world of fun hands-on activities, hemmed in with crafts and punctuated with KA's Mrs. Martin and everyone's favorite, our librarian, Mrs. O.!

If your child is entering First Grade..."FUN-Filled Transition to First Grade"

Join Mrs. Sifferman and Ms. Trevizo as each week of summer school we will introduce an exciting and fun new theme! Each theme will integrate math, reading and writing skills. We will review appropriate school behavior and protocol, while reviewing key academic skills. This summer school class is designed to strengthen what your student has already learned in kindergarten, which will make for a smooth transition into first grade!

If your child is entering Second Grade..."Soaring Into Second Grade"

This summer class will provide a fun opportunity for your child to practice the skills they learned in first grade. Together with Mrs. Ezell and Ms. Reyes we will explore, investigate, learn, and create while we get to know more about second grade by practicing our reading, writing, and math skills! Each week will be a different theme and incorporate fun crafts !

If your child is entering Third Grade..."Terrific in Third!"

Come learn the ins and outs of 3rd grade, while having fun, with Mrs. Lauck and Mrs. Bourgeois. We will focus on reading comprehension skills, fluency, vocabulary, grammar, and writing through a novel study. We will also review foundational math skills through center based activities. The students will have some fun with STEM activities as well. We will work each day to complete the summer requirements while preparing your child for a successful 3rd grade year ahead. We hope you will join us this summer.

If your child is entering Fourth Grade..."Fabulous Fourth Grade Fun!"

The fourth grade summer learning activities will be designed to be a fun, easy way for your child to practice important skills over the summer. We will have themed weeks during the program that will meet the criteria for the 4th grade learning standards. Students will have an opportunity to complete any summer requirements during their time in class. Mrs. Jaramillo and Ms. Zygarlicke will help students review and retain what they learned in the previous school year and delve deeper into academic subjects that spark their interest.

If your child is entering Fifth through Eighth Grade...

Incoming 5th through 8th grade students will work with Mrs. Nash and Ms. Behring on completing their required summer work while also having opportunities to learn leadership, communication, and life skills through exciting and fun enrichment activities. Students will be challenged to reflect on what it means to be a leader and then be tasked with practicing those skills through a variety of opportunities over the three weeks.

Week 1 will consist of games and activities that will engage students in team building and critical thinking while also practicing math and language arts skills. Week 2 and 3 will consist of economics and life skills activities. Week 2 will focus on learning the process of researching and choosing a college and career. Week 3 will consist of students learning about what it takes to start a business by coming up with an idea for their own food truck, and even learning how to make the food, too!

Depending on the need, students may also have weekly peer coaching opportunities where they will work with small groups or one-on-one with a student in the younger grades to guide them through an activity.
