Planned projects include felting (needle, nuno), rope baskets, artwear, and art purses, painting on fabric, shibori dyeing, and a Project Runway-like Unconventional Challenge where almost all components of a wall hanging would come from a hardware store. The Fiber Arts Club hosts a special exhibit at the biannual SaddleBrooke Quilt Show. We have a private group on Facebook where members share their creations, and we store instructions and other resource materials. Fiber Arts currently meets year-round on the first and third Friday of every month, from 1 pm - 4 pm in the Topaz Room.
