

**A Message from The Arizona State Department of Forestry and Fire Management**

SaddleBrooke Residents,

Starting in early March, the Arizona State Department of Forestry and Fire Management will begin implementation of a 276 acre project within the Arizona State Trust Land that borders your association.

This project aims to reduce the risk of wildfire to Saddlebrooke One and adjacent communities by reducing the density of encroaching mesquite trees and removing invasive plants.

Community protection and safety are top priorities at the Department of Forestry and Fire Management.

We ask that you help us maintain our safe work area by preserving a cautious distance from crews. Workers have been asked to limit inconveniences to residents wherever possible, but we appreciate your understanding that much of the equipment that is essential to complete our community protection goals may produce noise.
