Monday Evening's Talk: ***"iMercy: The Father Blesses"***

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on the unconditional love of the Father. Being a Christian means knowing your heavenly Father loves you not because you're good but because He is good. The evening concludes with an invitation to anyone, especially families (intact, broken, troubled, struggling, separated by distance, etc.), to receive a special blessing with the Oil of St. Joseph from the Oratory of St. Joseph in Montreal.

Scripture for Reflection: *Luke 12:29-32 (see reverse)*

Tuesday Evening's Talk: ***"iMercy: The Son Heals"***

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on the remedy the Father provides for us in His Son Jesus Who by His death on the Cross sets us free from sin, enables us to forgive and gives meaning to our suffering. The evening concludes with an invitation for those in need of healing (physical, emotional, spiritual) to adore our Eucharistic Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Scripture for Reflection: *John 19:25-27 (see reverse)*

Wednesday Evening's Talk: ***"iMercy: The Spirit Strengthens"***

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on the power of the Holy Spirit which enables us to live the Christian life and propels us to be witnesses of Jesus Christ in the world. The evening concludes with a sending forth blessing utilizing a first class relic of St. John Paul II taken from his blood-soaked sash on the day he was shot in St. Peter's Square.

MONDAY

Luke 12:29-32

As for you, do not seek what you are to eat and what you are to drink, and do not worry anymore. All the nations of the world seek for these things, and your Father knows that you need them. Instead, seek his kingdom, and these other things will be given you besides. Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom.

TUESDAY

John 19:25-27

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother’s sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, “Woman, behold, your son.” Then he said to the disciple, “Behold, your mother.” And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.

WEDNESDAY

2 Timothy 1:6-8

For this reason, I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God.
