
TWENTY FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

SEPTEMBER 23, 2018



For several Sundays we have been challenged by the message of the Cross on which Jesus is the Victim, united to all who suffer and to the poor and those the powerful of the world often discount. I have preached that when we ask "Where is God" in this suffering of the Cross, the answer is that God is with the Victim, with his Son Jesus on the Cross. God is on the side of the victim and not on the side of some in power who victimize or discount the suffering of others.

Last Sunday, in Mark 8:27-35, Peter answers the question of Jesus, who is Jesus? And Peter answers: "You are the Christ [Messiah]." Based on this profession of faith, Jesus will make the faith of Peter the rock upon which he builds his Church. Peter will be the prime leader of this Church. (see Matthew 16:13-18)

However, in the same passage of last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reveals that he will suffer greatly, be rejected and killed. Peter opposes this prediction because he is not expecting a Suffering Messiah, but rather an "Imperial Messiah." *Peter does not want a Messiah who identifies with the poor, but with the powerful.* Jesus has to rebuke Peter for not thinking like God does but as humans do. (see Mark 8:31-33)

Now on this Sunday, the Church skips over a portion of the Gospel after Mark 8:27-35 and picks up with Mark 9:30-37. Jesus again tells his disciples he will suffer and be betrayed and killed...and then raised from the dead. The Gospel says the disciples still do not understand him.

They do not understand him and they get into an argument with each other about who is the greatest among them! They are still thinking in terms of power and prestige. They want to identify with the powerful yet again.

And so Jesus begins to teach them:

"'If anyone wishes to be first,
he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

Taking a child, he placed it in their midst,
and putting his arms around it, he said to them,
'Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me;
and whoever receives me,
receives not me but the One who sent me." (Mark 9:35-37)

We might recall that on another occasion Jesus said "I have come to serve, not to be served." (Matthew 20:28)

Wouldn't that be a wonderful and instructional sign to engrave over every seminary entrance, the place where Priests are trained?

Another example of the servant identity of Jesus is when he washed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper. The washing of feet was a function of a slave or servant in the household. (Once again Peter protests that his leader Jesus should not do this!) On that occasion Jesus says to his disciples:

"You call Me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for *so* I am. If I then, the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I gave you an example that you also should do as I did to you." (John 13:13-15)

Then in today's Gospel, there is the example of the child. While children might have been cherished by their parents, in the view of the society of that day *they were powerless, insignificant, of lowly status*. Unwanted infants (usually female) would be abandoned to die. A Roman father could sell any of his children into slavery. Significantly, the Aramaic language (which Jesus spoke) and the Greek language (in which the New Testament was written) both had the same word for child and servant.

How very significant that Jesus identifies with the lowly one, the child, the servant. "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me." (Mark 9:37) And so he says God also is received in the lowly.

Consider the implications of all of this for our life, for how Church leadership should be exercised, for who the Church should always welcome and serve.


Welcome!

We welcome **Fr. Peter Kunnalakattu**, D.Min., BCC to Holy Faith and Gainesville. Fr. Peter will live for a time in the rectory of Holy Faith.

Fr. Peter is originally from India and has resided in the United States for 24 years, ministering primarily in hospital chaplaincy. In 2017 he began working for the Veterans Administration and was chosen to be the Catholic chaplain in Gainesville who will replace Fr. Dennis Young, current VA Catholic Chaplain who is retiring.

Fr. Peter will be working full-time at the VA Medical Center in Gainesville.





On Sunday September 30 we will celebrate our parish's patronal feast day, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. At the 11:15 Mass we will have Bishop Felipe Estévez as the Celebrant followed by a reception in the Parish Life Center. October 4th is the actual feast day of St. Francis, but the Church permits the celebration to be transferred to a Sunday for parishes with St. Francis as their Patron Saint.

Our parish is named after a mission in the Gainesville area established by Franciscan missionaries in 1606: Santa Fe de Toloco. The prevalence of the name Santa Fe in our area (including the river by the same name) is due to this mission of long ago. This and the 15 other missions located across north Florida were destroyed by English militia in 1702. Many Franciscans and other priests as well as Catholic natives were martyred. Florida has a historical marker at the location of the Santa Fe mission at Northern Alachua County C. R. 241 just after NW 294 Ave.

When our parish was established in 1973, we were named Holy Faith after the Santa Fe mission; and we acknowledge our spiritual connection with those Franciscan missionaries, so many years ago, and also our spiritual bond with St. Francis of Assisi. This is why we have a statue of St. Francis in our church and remember him in the Eucharistic Prayers when the patron saint is mentioned. The Parish Life Center also has many Franciscan themes throughout the building.

Now available once again, every Sunday from 9:00am-1:00pm during the 9:30am and 11:15am Masses.






