



Moses: In the Footsteps of the Reluctant Prophet, by Adam Hamilton (Abingdon Press)


Baptism Workbook: Coming to the Font by Ronald Byers, Eva Stinson & Donald McKim (Presbyterian Mission Agency)

This workbook from Congregational Ministries Publications reviews or introduces readers to some of the ways the church understands Baptism, drawing from both Scripture and reflection on the historic church. It is meant to be used by worship committees and session members considering the baptismal practices of their congregation. It is particularly meant to be used by these people with persons or groups of expectant parents and/or grandparents or for adults who have not yet been baptized and are seeking membership in the church. It may be used as a self-guided study, a group study or a reference for personal reflection.




Race and Reconciliation Workbook: Confessions of 1967 and Belhar by Clifton Kirkpatrick (Presbyterian Mission Agency)

PC(USA) through Congregational Ministry Publications presents us with another 6-week study. Written in celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Confession of 1967, this workbook is on both it and the Belhar confessions. Students are encouraged to embrace the ministry of reconciliation that has been done and is being done in the church amidst the divisions of race, nation, gender, economic status and religion. The workbook may be used as a self-guided study, a group study or a reference for reflection.



New Members Workbook: Call to Discipleship by Donald McKim, (Presbyterian Mission Agency)

Another in the denomination's *Being Reformed Workbook* series, this is written as an introduction to the PC(USA) and is a 6-session study. Recognizing that our church members come from many different places and, perhaps, denominations, this study tries to help us consider what discipleship as part of the PC(USA) looks like. The workbook is for people exploring discipleship or those considering becoming a member of the Presbyterian Church (USA).
