





The Legacy of Billy Graham, Michael G. Long, ed. (Westminster John Knox Press [WJK])

Considering that the evangelist Billy Graham has just passed away, it seems like an appropriate time to evaluate his ministry and the effect he had on the world. Published in 2008, the essays in Long's book neither lionize nor dismiss Graham but do take an honest and fair look at Graham's theology and preaching as well as his perspectives on economics, feminism, war, race relations, and other issues from his ministry and life.

Embraced and Embracing Workbook: Exploring the Foundations of Confirmation by Ronald Byars and Eva Stimson. (WJK)

This is the latest publication in the *Being Reformed* Workbook series. It is a workbook that explores Confirmation and might be used by anyone involved with planning confirmation classes, leaders of classes for adult new member enquirers, Christian education committees, pastors, or teachers. It would also be a good resource for parents, grandparents or guardians whose children may soon be in a confirmation class or those who want to know how to help the faith formation of their child who is being baptised. That covers most of the members of our congregations.



Six Themes Everyone Should Know (published by CMP, a ministry of the Presbyterian Mission Agency, PC(USA))

These are the first three in PC(USA)'s newest adult Bible study curriculum. They include **Six Themes in the Bible** by Barry Ensign-George, **Six Themes in Genesis** by W. Eugene March, and **Six Themes in Matthew** by James E. Davison. Each study is six lessons, which begin with a scripture, followed by discussion on a theme from that scripture. Each chapter includes questions for reflection. Each participant should have his or her own copy. Come in to the Resource Center, and see if one of these might be a good choice for one of your adult classes next fall or over the summer. There is a two-week limit on checking out these books so that they will be available for others to review.
