




VCR? What's That?



Here are the most recent upgrades:

The Jesus I Never Knew by Philip Yancy - a six-session adult study on the Life of Christ designed to broaden your understanding of the person, teachings and life of Jesus Christ.

Also by Philip Yancey is a 10-session adult study, **What's So Amazing about Grace?** Through true-life video interviews, Yancey introduces you to people's experiences, then takes your group into encounters with life-changing grace to give you a better understanding of just what grace is and why it is too precious.



Our next upgrade is not really for adults, though I know a few adults who would dispute that. **Dr. Seuss' Horton Hears a Who** has been a popular VHS movie that you may now enjoy on DVD. This half-hour animated movie is the original television classic. Horton is an elephant who hears a faint cry for help from a seemingly unimportant floating speck of dust. Horton puts his own safety on the line to save the speck's inhabitants. Besides the main feature, this DVD also includes three more Dr. Seuss stories: *Butter Battle Book*, *Daisy-Head Mayzie* and *Horton Hatches the Egg!* There is even a Dr. Seuss-like documentary, *In Search of Dr. Seuss*, as well as a sing-along music video, *You Can Hear Horton, Horton Can Hear You!* So check out this new DVD from the Resource Center for your youth group, Sunday school class or maybe even yourself.
