

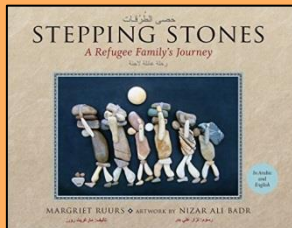

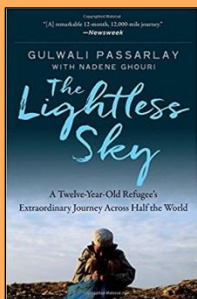
Create vs Copy: Embrace Change. Ignite Creativity. Break Through with Imagination

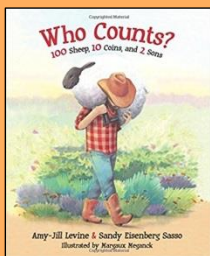
Stepping Stones: A Refugee Family's Journey, Margriet Ruurs, Art by Nizar Ali Badr, (Orca Book Publishing)

The Lightless Sky, Gulwali Passarlay with Nadine Ghouri (Harper One)

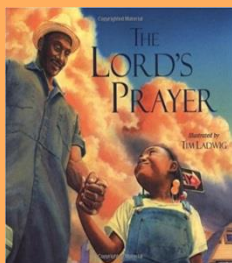
A true refugee's story, this is the tale of Gulwali Passarlay, who fled Afghanistan with his brother after his father and grandfather were killed by the Taliban. He escaped internment in both Turkey and Bulgaria to travel 12,000 miles to reach England.

This children's book by Westminster John Knox Press retells three of Jesus' parables. Included are the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin and the Prodigal Son. Young readers count to help the characters find what's missing. **Who Counts** teaches us that everyone matters and everyone should feel "counted."
