January 2 - Depart to the Holy Land arrive January 3 and transfer to Tel Aviv/Joppa.

January 5 -Mt. Arbel, Magdala, Boat Ride, Golan Heights, Capernaum, around the Sea of Galilee, stay in Nazareth

January 7 - Masada/ Qumran/ Dead Sea Floating/ Mt. Sodom / Negev/ Ramon Crater - Stay in Mitzpe Ramon

January 8 - Avdot/ Be'er sheba/ Marasha / Sha'aryiim/Elah Valley - Home stay in Bethlehem

January 9 -A day in Beth-Lehem - stay in Jerusalem

January 10 - Old City - Haram Al-Sharif/ Western Wall and many other sites - stay in Jerusalem

January 11 - Tour and Free time in the Old City of Jerusalem - stay in Jerusalem


January 12 - West Bank tour /Shiloh / Mt. Gezrim stay in Jerusalem
