



Including a CD of litanies, this collection of corporate prayers for congregational use includes liturgies of lament, for baptism and for communion.


Presbyterian Beliefs: Revised Edition by Donald K. McKim (Westminster John Knox (WJK))

Here is the 2017 revision of McKim's 2003 book about Presbyterian beliefs. Focusing on the Trinity, McKim moves from God to Christ to the Spirit and how it works in the church and our lives. A good resource for leadership training and confirmation classes, this is also a good choice for a new member study. Small and easy to read, **Presbyterian Beliefs** is an introduction to the major beliefs of Presbyterians. The revised edition includes recent changes in the new Form of Government and the Confession of Belhar.




Set up in a question-and-answer format, this revision of the 2003 book answers questions such as: Where do Presbyterian churches come from; What is the purpose of the Bible; Why do we sin and many others. Questions follow major themes such as Bible, Church, God, Jesus Christ, Humanity, Holy Spirit, Salvation, Church, Worship, Sacraments, Christian Life, the Reign of God and Polity. As followers of Christ, we are encouraged to ask questions and seek answers. This resource is a great way to start.

Besides a good book for new members or leadership training, it could be a major resource for a fun adult Sunday School class.

Beyond the Offering Plate by Adam J. Copland, ed, (WJK)

Copland has edited stories about the many dimensions of stewardship, such as time, work, body, mind, spirit, community, technology and more. (*Yes, there are more facets of stewardship*).
