Kanawha United Presbyterian Church will kick off its 200th anniversary year Sunday (January 27) with “A Bicentennial Concert.”

The concert will feature joyful music in celebration of the church’s long history as a community of faith. Performers are Elisabeth Baer, mezzo soprano; Ashley Dannewitz, soprano; Christopher Engel, organ and piano; Brienna Jenkins, soprano; Vicki Cavendish, piano; Emily Patterson, flute; and Jade Saul, euphonium.

Music selections include "'Badinerie' from Suite No. 2 in B Minor" - J.S. Bach, by Emily Patterson, flute; "Battle Hymn of the Republic" - arr. Tedd Smith and Don Hustad, a piano and organ duet by Vicki Cavendish and Christopher Engel; "'Finale' from Symphony No. 6 in G Minor" - Charles Marie Widor, Christopher Engel, organ; as well as solos and duets by Ashley Dannewitz, Elisabeth Baer, and Brienna Jenkins, and an instrumental solo by Jade Saul.

Kanawha United Presbyterian Church was founded March 14, 1819, and has been at its present location since 1885. The Rieger-Kloss company of Czechoslovakia custom-designed and built the magnificent pipe organ which was installed in the sanctuary in 1995. The church has long been dedicated to sharing its music ministry with the Charleston community through worship services and as a venue for concerts and recitals. Christopher Engel is the church’s music director and organist.

The concert will begin at 4 p.m. at Kanawha United Presbyterian Church, 1009 Virginia Street, East, Charleston (next door to Charleston Newspapers). There is no admission charge. Donations will be accepted to support the music programs at Kanawha Church, including the church’s Choral Scholars Program which supports young vocalists in the adult choir.
