Sustainable Young Adult Ministry: Making it Work, Making it Last by Mark DeVries and Scott Pointier (InterVarsity Press 2019)

The authors see six common mistakes that we make when thinking about a young adult ministry. The first is that we decide to learn about young adults before starting. This doesn't mean you shouldn't try to understand the people you are ministering to just that we must learn by being with young our particular young adults rather than counting on getting what we need to know from a book.

Another mistake is thinking that changing worship style will attract crowds of young adults. It won't. Worship mustn't be style over



substance. Four more mistakes and what we can learn from them await readers who look here for practical advice on actual ministry to young adults, not merely attracting crowds.

Scott Pointer is a consultant at Ministry Architects and lead pastor of Jamestown Harbor Church in Michigan.



This is an inviting study for beginners as well as seasoned readers of scripture, raising spiritual and ethical questions for participants. 



Starting from a blend of history, theology and cultural commentary, the authors show readers the damaging effects of the Doctrine of Discovery, particularly as it affects our Native Americans. Institutionalized, implicit doctrine that give Christians the right to claim territory that was already inhabited justified American triumphalism, white supremacy, and ongoing injustices. Our dominant culture has created an idolized history of discovery, while minority communities have been traumatized by colonization, slavery, segregation, and dehumanization.



Mark Charles is of Navajo and Dutch-American descent. He is a speaker, writer, and consultant on the complexities of American history, race, culture, and faith. He is a member of the Christian Reformed Church.

Soon-Chan Rah is a professor of Church Growth and Evangelism at North Park Theological Seminary in Chicago.
