




Under the leadership of Wright's longtime protégé, Wesley Peters, TAA dedicated itself to completing unfinished Wright projects and securing new commissions, however, they failed to develop a style of their own. This presentation surveys TAA's creative output and their role in the decline of modern architecture in the United States.
