SIMPLE ENTRANCE:

Opening Antiphon: *"Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out: Hosanna in the highest!"*

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

Reading I: Isaiah 50:4-7

Responsorial Ps 22: *"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"*

1. *All who see me scoff at me, they mock me with parted lips, they wag their heads; "He relied on the Lord; let him deliver him, let him rescue him, if he loves him."*
