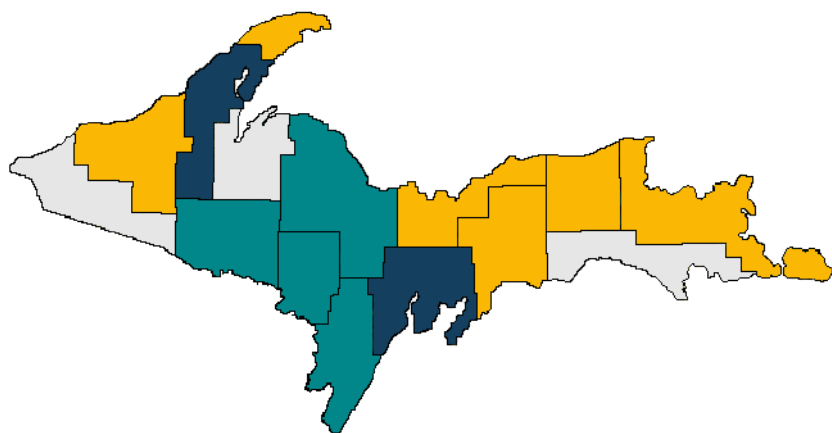

With the continued prevalence of COVID-19 cases in the Upper Peninsula, it is more important than ever that we keep it UP with best practices and sensible steps to ensure that we stay safe and open for business – however, there are still positives to the landscape here. As of October 7th:

- The U.P. continues to have adequate hospital capacity, with the region having lower occupancy rates than most every other of the State's regions. For instance, the U.P. has a total inpatient occupancy rate of only 40% (while most every other region in the State is between 60% and 78%).
- The U.P. continues to have a low average daily infection rate, at an average of 2.32% of the State's total infection rate.
- The U.P.'s positive infection rate (2.34%) is still less than the baseline Health Departments seek; additionally its three public universities are even lower (1.58%).
- Over half of the counties still have never had a COVID-19 related death.
