





“Future Behavioral Health Professionals

In 2015, acknowledging the growing need for qualified addiction and mental health professionals to help those struggling with addiction and co-occurring disorders, AAC decided to launch an educational scholarship program to assist students who were enrolled in college programs in the area of Behavioral Health. We established our Behavioral Health scholarship awards to provide financial assistance that would enable undergraduate and graduate students to pursue careers in the areas of behavioral health and addiction-related studies.




1. Essays will be judged on story presentation, mechanics and organization.

- 2. Add an original poem to Power Poetry by **Thursday, June 27, 2019**. You'll need to register as a member of our community first.


From the SCHOLARSHIP FAQ:




Eligibility: US citizens or permanent residents with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and enrolled or planning to enroll in an accredited college or university in Fall 2019.





\$2,000 Bachus & Schanker, LLC Scholarship, Deadline for Spring semester: July 30, 2019; Deadline for Fall semester: Nov 30, 2019

Selected criteria from website: "Understanding the importance of a quality education, Bachus & Schanker, LLC created a scholarship meant to enable students to better focus on their intellectual development and career goals.

Students have the opportunity to apply for one of the \$2000 semiannual scholarships to be paid toward tuition for the upcoming semester.

Each student must write an essay about his or her opinion(s) on the importance and efficacy of the 7th Amendment. Students are encouraged to think critically about the right to trial by a jury, and other elements of the Amendment, and it how affects their lives.

How to Apply

Eligible Students Will: Write an essay of no fewer than 800 words about your opinion on the importance and efficacy of the 7th Amendment and how it affects your life. Consideration for the entirety of the Amendment (rather than the well-known nutshell explanation of the right to trial by jury) is encouraged.

Who Can Apply

Any high school senior accepted to attend a four-year university by the time of the award, or full-time student attending a four-year university in the United States who carries a 3.0 cumulative GPA may apply.

Selection Process and Notification

The Bachus & Schanker, LLC Scholarship Committee will review each application and notify the winning student of their award by email."
