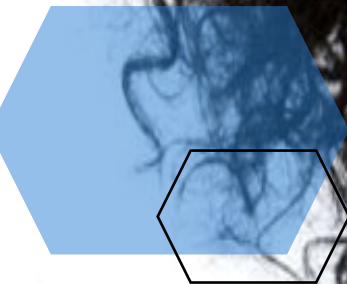

A high school, college or graduate student or a student planning to enter college

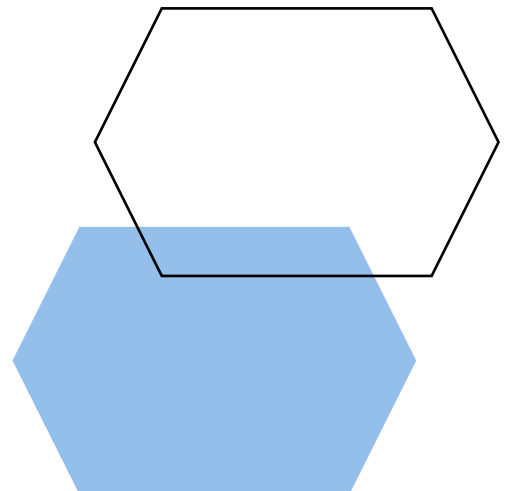

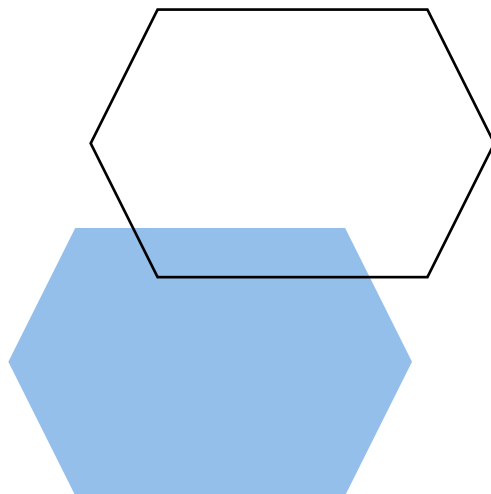

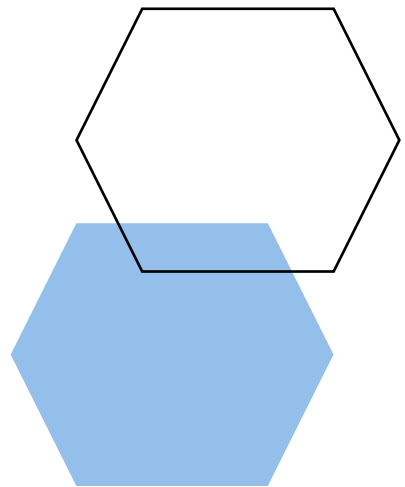

Resume submissions can come in word, PDF, or info-graphic format, attached to an email and sent to scholarship@resumecompanion.com. The body of the email should include:

University attending (if applicable)

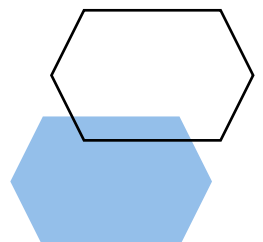
Short explanation of who's resume you are submitting

All applications will receive a confirmation email upon receipt on our end.

1. Staff at Resume Companion remember the hardship of being a student so want to make this scholarship available to as many students as possible! As such, we do not require any sort of minimum GPA, and both domestic and international students may apply.

2. All applicants must be enrolled, or due to be enrolled, in full time university education for the semester they are applying to receive the scholarship fund. For example, a senior high student can apply during the Spring 2017 semester, despite still being at high school, as long as they will be enrolled in university for the Fall semester 2017 when they are due to receive the scholarship fund.

3. One application can be made per student, per year.”

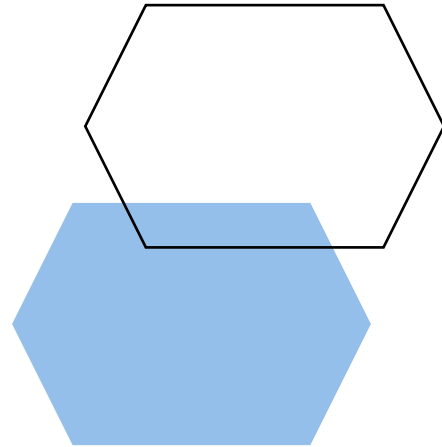

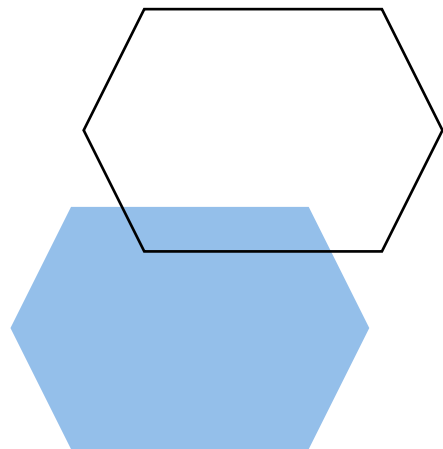

Selected criteria from website: “Understanding the importance of a quality education, Bachus & Schanker, LLC created a scholarship meant to enable students to better focus on their intellectual development and career goals.

Students have the opportunity to apply for one of the \$2000 semiannual scholarships to be paid toward tuition for the upcoming semester.

Each student must write an essay about his or her opinion(s) on the importance and efficacy of the 7th Amendment. Students are encouraged to think critically about the right to trial by a jury, and other elements of the Amendment, and it how affects their lives.

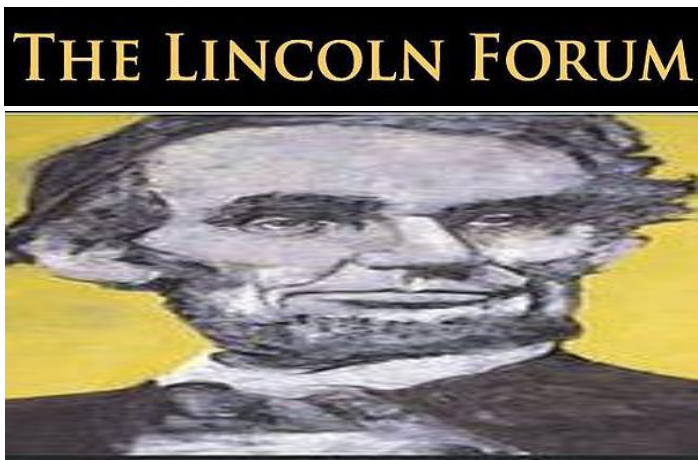
Who Can Apply

Any high school senior accepted to attend a four-year university by the time of the award, or full-time student attending a four-year university in the United States who carries a 3.0 cumulative GPA may apply.

Selection Process and Notification

\$1,500, \$750 and \$500 Platt Family Scholarship Prize Essay Contest, D: July 31, 2019

You must be a full time, undergraduate student in an American college or university during the Spring 2019 semester. You do not have to be an American citizen, but you do need to be attending an American college or university during the eligibility period.

Selected criteria (read the complete rules at the link above):

“Our Topic for 2019: Abraham Lincoln: Our Greatest President?”

In surveys and polls, historians and the public have consistently ranked Abraham Lincoln as America’s greatest president. Why has Lincoln earned and retained first place, and do you agree that he deserves this status.

Contest Rules (Selected criteria)

- The scholarship essay contest is designed for students who are FULL TIME, undergraduate students in an AMERICAN COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY during the Spring 2019 semester. The July 31 deadline is designed to give these students time to finish their essays, if need be, after final exams.
- You do not have to be an American citizen, but you do need to be attending an AMERICAN COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY during the eligibility period.
- It is NOT open to high school students. Key question to consider; when we contact your college or university registrar will they be able to confirm that you were enrolled as a full-time college student during the spring 2019 semester? If the answer is no, you are not eligible.
- Entries must contain a minimum of 1,500 and a maximum of 5,000 words.
- Essays may be submitted via regular mail (postmarked by July 31, 2019) or via e-mail (time stamped before midnight July 31, 2018) to the address below.
- The essay must be typed and include a works-cited page or bibliography. End notes are suggested but not required.
- Applicants must include the name of their college or university with their entire and all contact information (regular and email address) must be put on the essay proper.
- Checks from the Lincoln Forum will be sent to the winners in December 2019 The scholarship prize money is designed as a reward for academic excellence. It can be used for any purpose the winner desires.”

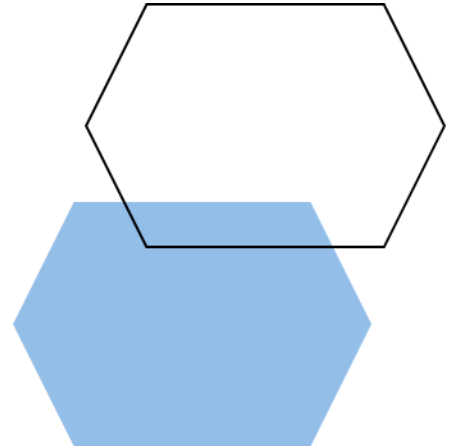

Scholarship FAQ

What do I need to write about in my essay?

We want to encourage students to examine their driving habits and identify ways in which they commonly become distracted behind the wheel. These could include obvious examples such as texting, tweeting, or changing music, or a less obvious example like turning to talk to friends or simply playing the music so loudly that they cannot hear other vehicles. Next, we want students to consider and document concrete steps to ending those distracted driving behaviors.”
