PNW Chapter,



There are still opportunities for sponsorships for your companies, both general and event specific, so please reach out and get involved!



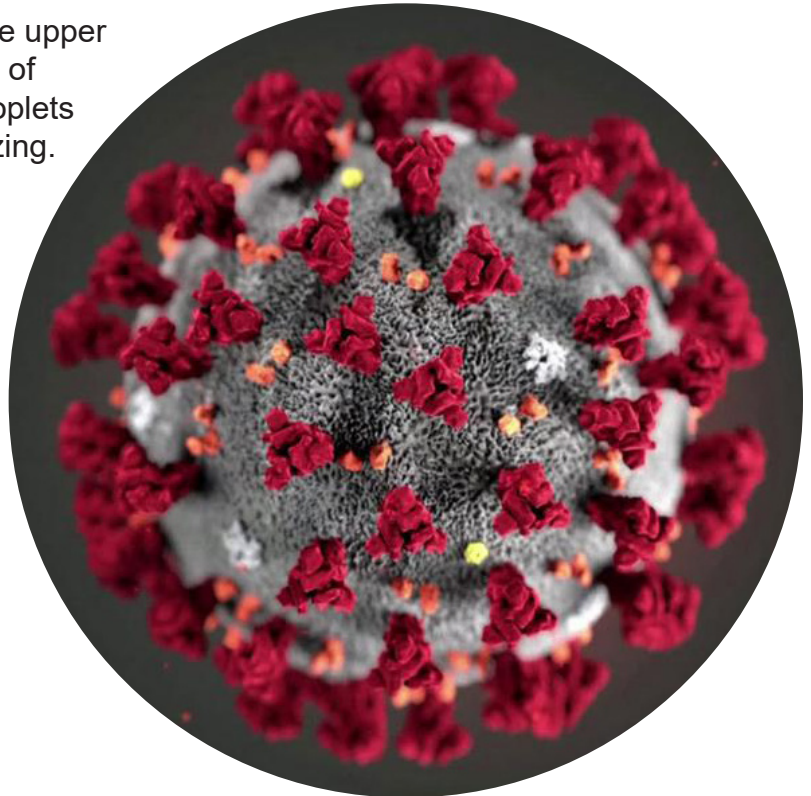

COVID-19 Update

Coronavirus is a virus which can infect both the upper and lower respiratory tracts and lead to a form of pneumonia. Coronavirus is spread through droplets transmitted into the air from coughing or sneezing. Signs and symptoms are fever, coughing, and shortness of breath. It is especially dangerous for the elderly and those with significant underlying conditions including heart, lung, kidney disease; diabetes; and conditions that suppress the immune system.

Best practices:

- Practice basic hygiene - wash hands regularly, disinfect surfaces that are commonly used such as desks, laptops, phones, doorknobs, etc.
