2022 Parish Survey

Episcopal Church of the Resurrection, Blue Springs, MO

Several months ago Father David Lynch announced his intention to retire from active ministry effective October 1, 2022. His decision triggered the creation of a Search Committee for a new rector of the Church of the Resurrection.

Before the Search Committee engages in a formal process of looking for a new priest, it is necessary to fully understand and appreciate the wants and needs of the members of the Church of the Resurrection in their next pastoral leader.

This survey not only asks several sets of questions about our congregation's current ministry and your own involvement, but also seeks your input on pastoral leadership and your vision for our future.

There are **36 questions** in the survey divided into seven sections:

- 1. Your Church Participation (13 questions)
- 2. Your Stewardship (2 questions)
- 3. Your Worship Preferences (2 questions)
- 4. Your Priorities for the Church of the Resurrection (1 question)
- 5. The Qualities you desire in our next Rector (8 questions)
- 6. The Future of the Church of the Resurrection (2 questions)
- 7. Background Information about Yourself (8 questions)

Completing this survey ensures that your views have been heard. We ask each member of your household 16 years of age and older complete the survey. The survey should take most people no longer than 30 minutes.

Unanswered items reduce the usefulness of the survey.
