



With only two performances left on the schedule, we're nearing the end of a very successful 54th season.

Six shows on our schedule were canceled due to COVID, starting with the first three shows of our spring tour in January. For those who followed us on the road, you rarely saw the same show twice! Indeed, over half of our shows were filled with multiple solo understudies, instrumental substitutes, and choreography re-blocks. Arguably the greatest number of show changes a Singers troupe has ever needed to perform.
