There were 78 in attendance and a small number may have watched on livestream. There were 71 ballots cast; all voting was done in person.

ASSOCIATE LEAD PASTORS' REPORT

Pastor Carla highlighted changes and challenges over the past year. Pastoral and staff team has risen to the task. Connections made for youth and young adults; Worship Arts team continued to lead; women's Bible study groups met online & in person; Intercultural Ministries reached around the world; we said good-bye to Ian; staff have worked from home and office. Pastor Carla is very grateful for staff, all of whom she recognized by name.

Roof/HVAC/fire suppression project completed. Thanks to Facilities Committee for oversight; Dan Thul and Fred Vine were recognized for the time and experience they lent to the project.

Key Staff Changes: Because our church is now a smaller size, the staff team changed accordingly. Jerry Orthner's role will change to part-time, with focus on preaching & pastoral care; Roland Feltmate completed his time as pastor. Grateful for the ministry and leadership of these two. Eric Lai to oversee seniors; Tim Gibbons will oversee Alpha and First Impressions and release Justice & Compassion responsibilities to Tim Beadle. Part-time staff have also been released in several areas—Children's Ministries, Worship Arts, Intercultural Ministries. Rick & Patti Love will trade roles in Intercultural Ministries and Love New Canadians, so that Rick will now be Pastor of Intercultural Ministries and Patti will lead Love New Canadians, with each supporting the other.

Our Shepherd Jesus leads us despite changes. Discerning Together process exciting to participate in and led to commitment to Follow Jesus and Connect in Community.

Our church is God's people, loved by Father, following Jesus, filled by Holy Spirit and continuing on a Transforming Journey.

TREASURER'S REPORT: BUDGET

Lawrence Stalder thanked the Finance Committee, accountant Bianca Zhou and bookkeepers Sonja Guderjan and Joy Stalder for their work on the budget. He presented the Treasurer's Budget Report, which was circulated previously to the membership and congregation. We are currently at approximately 98% of the projected budget amounts. Congregants are now encouraged to give funds as the Lord leads rather than giving all to the General Fund and transferring funds where they are needed. Thanks to the congregation for the blessing of their faithful giving.

Question: What percentage of General Fund goes to the Western Canadian District?

Answer: 3%

Building Fund comments

Recent interest rate raises will extend mortgage payments to 2026 since higher percentage will go to interest. As mortgage is paid off, maintenance/repair costs on aging building will continue to increase. The Lord has blessed the recent roof/HVAC/fire suppression project.

Missions Fund comments

Canadian Ministries (New Ventures Fund) has helped to support Glacier Ridge Church and Horizon Church. As Horizon has emerging church status, their leadership team will approve their budget; we still do admin support but no longer have to approve their budget. Lawrence commented that though much giving is done online or automatically, we still need volunteer tellers to count offerings on Sundays. Gord Miller thanked Lawrence Stalder and the Finance Committee.

MOTION G: Marilyn Wallace moved, Jim Palmer seconded, that the report on the 2021-22 Foothills Alliance Church financial results be accepted as presented. **Carried.**

Gord Miller reflected on things we have learned over last couple of years:

- God is very present, even in a virtual setting.
- 2020 Project: Body has great gifts, which were shared in devotionals; thanks to 2020 writers.
- Listening together in discerning process: rich history, God has blessed, excitement for future. Thanks to Discernment Committee.
- Recognized Search Committee; continue to pray as interviews conducted.

Questions: Has church growth study ever been done to see the growth over the years?

Answer: BOE constantly listening & evaluating; action taken at crucial times, i.e. church plant

As a member, Brent Trask expressed gratitude for leadership and members of Foothills. As District Superintendent, he mentioned that several hundred churches (not just C&MA) in Calgary are suffering severe contraction, estimating 40,000 former believers/parishioners in Calgary are "AWOL," on their way to desertion from community of believers; pray they will come home.

Gord Miller quoted Romans 12 and 2 Peter 1: Lead with diligence and apply diligence to your faith. Thank you to those elders who have served six years with diligence—Sharon Anderson, Seyi Odewale, Terry Hawley.

Lead Pastor's Report



JESUS IS MAKING ALL THINGS NEW!

As I recollect upon the past year at Foothills Alliance Church, I am filled with a sense of gratitude and joy at the work of God in our midst. A new day has dawned on Foothills Alliance Church because of the kindness of God towards us. I am overwhelmed by the generosity, perseverance, and service of the hundreds of volunteers and our exceptional staff team. Our church would not be what it is without you.

As I arrived at Foothills in September, we were a church in significant transition. There were questions about what type of church Foothills would be in the days ahead. Would we become a church in decline or would there be a resurgence in our church? After a year of pruning, would new fruit be born by our church? And Jesus was gracious to give us much fruit!

Ministry highlights and opportunities over the past year include:

- Nearly 100 decisions made for Christ, particularly through our children's ministry! We also celebrate the youth and adults within Foothills who have come to faith.
- Many baptisms of new believers, some of whom have no spiritual background at all. Many of these decisions came through our amazing Alpha programs!
- Helping many Ukrainian evacuees find homes and shelter in Canada.
- Our OnRamp gathering, a place for newcomers to connect in community, was twice the attendance we had expected (nearly 100 people)
- Our ESL programming now serves nearly 300 people on a regular basis.
- Our worship gatherings have grown from averaging 750 in the fall to an average of 1000 over the past 6 weeks!
- Our children's ministry is now averaging 150 kids per weekend and we are anticipating a phenomenal season of summer camp!
- Our Senior's ministry is growing and expanding with new programming and new people on a weekly basis!
- We hosted the Advance Evangelist's Summit that gathered evangelists and mission-oriented leaders from across Canada—equipping them for even greater fruitfulness!

Lead Pastor's Report

- We celebrate the expansion of our worship arts teams and the reintroduction of dance, spoken word and drama to our church family.
- Our Justice and Compassion fund has been so generously funded that we have put together a Taskforce, dreaming about how we might meet needs through deeds in the city of Calgary.
- We were privileged to walk with many families through the loss of loved ones. It is a privilege and sacred duty to care for families in mourning.
- We ran a Holy Spirit Encounter in partnership with our District family and saw nearly 100 people in attendance, with many people deeply encountering Christ in profound ways!
- We partnered with 10 different congregations to hold a beautiful Good Friday service where we celebrated the unity and atoning work of Christ, regardless of denomination.
- Our facility has been a significant hub for community activity and has been a blessing not only to our church but to our neighbours as well!

The fruit has been plentiful! And our belief is that the best is yet to come! As a result of the fruit we have seen, we have had to add members to our staff team. As our youth ministry has been growing and expanding, we added Jason Balzer as a Youth Pastor and are looking forward to resourcing parents as they walk with their teens in the days ahead. We added Dan Delamont to be our Technical Director—leveraging technology to help even more people connect with Christ. Finally, just a few weeks ago we added Jason Fan as the Pastor of Care and Outreach so that we might reach more neighbours for Christ and heighten our sense of pastoral care across all the ministries of Foothills. We have much to be thankful for. Additionally, we hold Pastor Tim Beadle in our prayers as he walks through cancer treatments. He is a faithful servant and was a steady hand when Foothills was in transition. Finally, we were excited to bless Pastor Carla Olsen Draper with a sabbatical that began in mid-April and will conclude in mid-August. Please pray for Pastors Tim and Carla in these respective seasons.

On a personal note, I want to say how grateful I am to be a part of Foothills Alliance Church. When my family made the decision to come here, there was a significant sacrifice as we were leaving a church we loved very much. We were worried that we would feel deep loneliness and regret.

And by God's grace and your hospitality, we LOVE being a part of Foothills Alliance Church. You have been so gracious, welcoming and hospitable to my family and I; and we could not be more grateful. We have no sense of loneliness and feel at home at Foothills. My boys often comment that they are thrilled to be here and Lauren and I agree entirely!

WORSHIP ARTS

We have been able to do so by adding 10 volunteers to our music and tech team, involving lay leaders to the weekly scripture reading team and by hiring Dan as our new tech manager.

GLOBAL IMPACT TEAM

The work of the Global Impact Team (GIT) continues to work from week to week in supporting dozens of International Workers (Missionaries) around the world. This past year we have enhanced our lobby's 'Mission Corner' to give video updates of those we support, along with weekly prayer lists (thank to Velma Warnock). Recently we learned that Foothills contributed more than any other Alliance Church in Canada to our national Global Advance Fund that supports International Workers in dozens of countries. In addition, we support over a dozen other IW's based out of their affiliation with Foothills — you can pick up their prayer cards in our missions corner. This spring, we held a Missions Sunday with multiple booths set up in the lobby for church members to engage with those who serve in our region. Thanks to Dave Anderson and GIT for leading us in the cause of missions — both local and global.

SENIORS

Some people are not too keen to be called seniors because in their minds they can only think of aging. What they have overlooked, however, is the vast and rich accumulation of experiences, wisdom and refining of character in this group of people. In addition to more leisure time and less financial burdens, many seniors (55+) are still very much in full mobility with an agile mindset. They want to use their invaluable insights, wisdom and life experiences to make a difference at this prime stage of their lives. Thus the seniors (55+) ministry at Foothills is all about building a joyful community for mutual support as well as being a beacon to point others to Jesus. The golden years are truly golden when we live with Christ as the center of all our activities.

Our attendance has been growing, as we have had 60+ seniors attend the biweekly Wellness Class, and on average 100 seniors attend the monthly Prime Tymer's Luncheon, with the highest record of 165.

In 2023 we added new gatherings such as Coffee Time (50 seniors), Singing Time (20), Hobby Time (7), Transitions (Estate Planning, 30) and Caring for the Wounded Heart (10).

INTERCULTURAL MINISTRY

After teaching our ESL classes online for 2.5 years, in September of 2022 we restarted our in-person classes. We felt like we were starting over, but very quickly students and volunteers started to show up for our in-person classes. We now send our weekly email to 649 students and volunteers! This year we have had students and/or volunteers from China, Ukraine, Spain, South Korea, Malaysia, Japan, Taiwan, Israel, Peru, Colombia, Mexico, Brazil, Venezuela, Nigeria, Hungary, West Asia and the Middle East. During our busiest week, we had 283 students and volunteers in 13 ESL classes.



That week we had 170 attend our stage-1 classes that focus on friendship, 81 at our stage-2 ESL Bridges class for the spiritually curious and 32 at our stage-3 classes that focus on what it means to follow Jesus. We're trusting the Spirit of God to lead more of those at stage-1 toward the classes that focus on the life and teaching of Jesus in stage-2 and stage-3!

CHILDREN

In the past year, we have had 5 children dedicated and 36 make a decision for Jesus in Sunday School.

At our Summer camps in 2022, we had 47 Preschool kids and 231 Grade School kids attend and learn about Jesus' words from Matthew 6:11 "Give us this day our daily bread." These words serve as a reminder that everything we have comes from God - and that it's by turning to God in prayer that all our daily needs are met. 90 kids made the decision to follow Jesus and we handed out 140 Bibles.

The children also prepared a Christmas Performance with drama and a choir, where they portrayed the birth of Jesus in the manger.



JUSTICE & COMPASSION

The J & C focus at Foothills expresses the heart and hands of Jesus to the needy in our church and surrounding community. Over the past year the list has grown as to the practical J&C expressions in addressing needs... Backpacks for kids returning to school – Grief Care for those experiencing bereavement – Harvest Food Drive – Support for the Pregnancy Care Centre - Christmas Family sponsorships – Support for rent relief and gift cards to put food on the table of families. This year we were a district hub for Samaritan's Purse's Operation Christmas Child and collected over 900 shoeboxes for needy children around the world. We have also focused on supporting Ukrainian refugees moving to Calgary. Thanks to those in our Foothills family who have responded in opening their homes. This spring a task force was established to consider recommendations for stewarding monies entrusted to us – over 10 new partners and projects were identified worthy of financial investments to continue our desire to meet the needs and injustice suffered by so many in our city and province. Thanks to Ryan Reed, Garrick Fryklind and the J&C team that has been expanded to continue planning in addressing opportunities in the coming months.

VOLUNTEER MINISTRIES

Over the past year we have ramped up our capacity to engage all of our faith community in finding their best serve at Foothills. Thanks to our volunteer coordinator Kim Gordon for leading the charge in helping us understand our place in God's kingdom. (Eph 2:10) Work behind the scenes has taken place, with our staff, in creating a streamlined Volunteer Pathway for those who desire to get involved. We also produced an updated Ministry Directory for sharing all of the options and openings for getting involved. Spiritual gift surveys have also been used to understand how God has gifted each one to serve in the church. To conclude the ministry year, our first annual Volunteer Appreciation event occurred in April with close to 200 volunteers in attendance – Thanks to Tereasa Basaraba who worked with Kim to put on an event that inspired and appreciated those who serve so faithfully from week to week. We look forward to more volunteers finding their 'best serve' at Foothills in the coming year.



LIFE GROUPS

REPORT FROM NOMINATING COMMITTEE FOR 2023 ANNUAL REPORT

The 2022-2023 Foothills Alliance Nominating Committee consists Kyle Harnett (Lead Pastor), Sharon Anderson (congregant), Daryl Ginter (congregant), Miles Dyck (elder) and Karen Vine (elder). The Nominating Committee's mandate is to "nominate sufficient qualified candidates to fill the number of specified board positions. Women and men are eligible to be elected as elders, provided they meet all other qualifications in the bylaws." The Nominating Committee is responsible to ensure that all persons being nominated for eldership meet the qualifications required by Scripture, as well as required by the Local Church Constitution and Bylaws. The nominating process involves meeting several times for discussion, interviews and consideration. Prayer and reflection inform each step. Foothills elders are elected for one-year terms, to a maximum of six consecutive terms. 

The General Fund supports the main ministries and functions of the church, including the cost of day-to-day operations. With the closure of Glacier Ridge, we are covering the 2022-23 transition costs. For 2023-24 there is a potential liability of \$111K lease costs if we cannot find a sub lease for the Glacier Ridge location. There will be a motion for the members to approve the expenditure of \$450K of the 22-23 surplus for \$150K each to mortgage payment, facility upgrades and worship arts.

School Report

FOOTHILLS ALLIANCE PRESCHOOL & KINDERGARTEN

Since 1993 Foothills Alliance Preschool and Kindergarten has been making a positive Christian impact in NW Calgary. The school offers Preschool, Kindergarten and Early Intervention Services to children aged three to six. With full enrolment our school services 166 families annually (142 Preschool and 24 Kindergarten).

During the 2022/2023 school year we ran five Preschool classes and one Kindergarten (AM only). The school has not yet returned to pre-pandemic student numbers. This year we registered 110 Preschoolers and 24 Kindergarten children.

The school has noticed an increase in the number of children with Special Needs. Through our Solid Foundations programming, we are able to access government funding and provide children with speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, behavioral support and dedicated classroom assistants at no extra cost to families. This year we turned our unused entrance space into a dedicated therapy and alternative programming area for our children with more severe and specialized needs. To meet the needs of our students it was necessary to increase our staff. Currently the school has 16 employees and 5 contracted therapists.

We are very proud of the program we are able to offer at Foothills Alliance School. We help children grow socially, spiritually and academically. Our students hear the message of Christ through the teaching of social thinking, Bible stories and prayer. We encourage our students to show the love of Christ to their fellow students (sharing, praising), their parents (helping, obeying) and their community (giving, sharing, service – Operation Christmas Child, Food Bank, Mustard Seed, etc.).

Teachers at Foothills Alliance School are University educated and maintain a high standard of professional development.

Foothills Alliance School is a loving Christ centered community that encourages lifelong learning and growth for staff, students and families.

Church Plants

HORIZON CHURCH | GLACIER RIDGE

As of March 2022 Horizon Church became a Developing Church with the WCD of the C&MA and is now governed by an Advisory Committee appointed by the C&MA Western Canadian District (WCD), District Superintendent (DS) and the church's legal oversight moved from the mother church (Foothills Alliance) to the DS. The next step in church governance progression for a Developing Church is to become an Organized Church within the C&MA. This is determined by the DS and the legal oversight and governance moves to a Board of Elders that is elected by the Horizon church membership.

While some churches within the C&MA such as RockPointe and First Alliance are structured with multiple or satellite locations, Horizon is not a satellite location of Foothills Alliance. Horizon Church has achieved its goal to move to a developing church and will ultimately move to an organized church under their own Board of Elders. Foothills Alliance Church has a long history of initiating church plants. Foothills Alliance is a church plant of First Alliance. RockPointe is a church plant of Foothills Alliance. Foothills will continue to pray for and assist Horizon as they grow through planting new expressions of the church in other parts of our city! In the past year, Horizon Church sent Joshua and Madyson Rice to a Church Planting Assessment that was organized and led by the WCD New Ventures team. Coming out of that assessment, Horizon has begun a Church Planting Apprenticeship with Josh, with the goal in mind to send the Rice's and a core team to plant a new expression of the church in the southwest quadrant of the city!



GLACIER RIDGE
CHURCH

Glacier Ridge Church (GRC) was a church plant of Foothills Alliance Church (Foothills) planted in 2018 north of Stoney Trail and west of 14th Street in Calgary. In Dec 2022, after prayerfully considering the options in front of them, the Glacier Ridge Church Leadership Team discerned and recommended that their congregants join with Horizon church as of February 1, 2023. Horizon Church is also a church plant of Foothills and aligns well with GRC's calling of "walking in the way of Jesus." The GRC Leadership team recognized that joining Horizon may not be suitable for all of their congregants and worked with individuals to help them integrate into a church body that is best for them. For some this included joining us here at Foothills.

This means that the GRC Congregation concluded their ministry at the end of January 2023. This prayerful decision came with the support of our Foothills BOE, Horizon church leadership and the Western Canadian District of The Alliance. While there was a degree of sadness at this announcement, we are thankful for the many good things God has done in and through GRC and look forward to how God will work His Kingdom purposes out of this. When a congregation chooses to conclude its ministry there are obvious implications for the pastoral leadership. The Foothills Board of Elders recognized that this draws to a conclusion the employment of Rev. Cam Loewen. Foothills has a long and deep relationship with the Loewen's and thank the Loewen family for their Godly and fruitful leadership these past five years. Cam and the GRC Leadership team expressed their thankfulness to their Foothills family for their transitional support as they discern the next steps in their lives and ministry. We would encourage you to keep the Loewen's in your prayers as they take a time of restoration and discernment. Your elders are available to respond to any questions. Bylaws

I. NAME

1. The corporate name of this church shall be the Foothills Alliance Church of the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada.
2. These bylaws supplement the Local Church Constitution as adopted and approved by the General Assembly of The Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada as amended from time to time. In cases where these bylaws conflict with the Local Church Constitution, the provisions of the Local Church Constitution shall apply.

II. GOVERNMENT

1. There shall be two classes of membership, Voting Membership and Associate Membership. They shall conform to the requirements for membership as set out in the Local Church Constitution and any additional membership policies approved by the Board of Elders.
2. There shall be an annual meeting held within six (6) calendar months of the fiscal year-end of the church, the exact date to be determined by the Board of Elders.
3. Notice of time and place of any meeting of the membership shall be given publicly on at least two consecutive weekends prior to the meeting date or by written notice to each active member of the church fourteen (14) days prior to the meeting. In the case of a special meeting of the membership called by the Board of Elders, notice shall include advertisement to the membership of the purpose of said meeting.
4. The quorum for any meeting of the membership shall consist of members present. For the purpose of determining quorum, a member may be present in person, by written signed proxy or by electronic means approved in advance by the Board.
5. The business proceedings of any meeting of the membership shall be governed by the Constitution and Bylaws to the extent applicable. In other cases, the current issue of Robert's Rules of Order shall apply.
6. The fiscal year shall end June 30th of each year.
7. Upon approval by the Board of Elders of a written request, a member may view specified church records in the presence of a member of the Board of Elders, subject to any additional requirements outlined in a Board of Elders approved Records Management Policy.
8. At the Board's discretion any meeting of the membership can include participation by telephone, electronic or other communication facilities that permit participants to vote and communicate adequately with each other during a meeting of members in the manner provided by the policies and procedures of Foothills Alliance Church. A person participating in a meeting by such means is deemed to be present at the meeting.

III. BOARD OF ELDERS

1. The maximum number of elders is twelve (12). The Board of Elders will annually determine the number of elders three (3) months prior to the annual meeting.
2. The quorum for a meeting of the Board of Elders shall be one half of its membership.
3. The officers of the church shall consist of chairman, vice-chairman, secretary and treasurer.
4. Elders are elected for a one-year term.
5. Elders are eligible to serve a maximum of six (6) consecutive years after which they must have a one-year sabbatical before becoming eligible to serve again. If an elder serves for a partial year, that year shall count as a full year of the consecutive years of service.
6. An elder will have been a member of Foothills Alliance Church for at least six (6) months prior to serving as a member of the Board of Elders.
7. If a member of the congregation wishes to have a candidate considered for eldership, they must submit in writing the person's name and qualifications to the chair of the Nominating Committee at least five (5) weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting. The submission must have the signatures of at least three (3) members in good standing.
8. The Nominating Committee is responsible to ensure that all persons being nominated for eldership meet the qualifications required by Scripture as well as required by the Local Church Constitution and these Bylaws.
9. The Nominating Committee will nominate sufficient qualified candidates to fill the number of specified board positions. Women and men are eligible to be elected as elders provided they meet all other qualifications in the by-laws. The Nominating Committee is allowed to present as many candidates as it finds suitable.
10. To be elected, nominees for the position of Elder will require a two-thirds majority of ballots cast by members voting at a meeting of the membership.

IV. NOMINATING COMMITTEE

1. The Nominating Committee shall consist of the Lead Pastor or his appointee and a minimum of four (4) members with equal representation from the Board of Elders and the membership.
2. The Lead Pastor, or his appointee, shall serve as chair of the Nominating Committee.

V. AMENDMENTS

1. These Bylaws may be amended from time to time by a three-quarters (3/4) majority vote at the annual meeting or a special meeting of the membership called for such purpose.
2. Proposed amendments to the Bylaws shall be posted at least two (2) weekends prior to the meeting of the membership at which they are to be considered.
