



Volunteer Activity: Frog Trap Washing Assistants

Frog traps and population data go hand in hand. We need help to make sure our gear is ready to help endangered frogs.

We need help counting, cleaning and storing traps.

The Work:

- We're looking for eager volunteers to help power wash, sort, fold and count several hundred frog traps.
- This role will require driving to an outdoor rural location on Bradner Road in Abbotsford (no public transportation is available).
- Learn about our work with native frogs in an informal setting.

Why It's Helpful:

 Our Precious Frog program is essential for the monitoring and conservation of the highly endangered Oregon Spotted Frog. These traps are used to get population estimates and monitor the status of frogs at our known sites.

What To Expect:

- Be prepared to spend the day moving, sorting, washing and counting frog traps.
- There will be lots of bending and lifting.
- Work will be wet and somewhat dirty. Be prepared for that.
- Must be able to keep track of numbers and sort efficiently.
- Wear weather-appropriate clothing and comfortable footwear.
- Please, bring your own lunch, water and snacks.
