

Hilaria was connected with the YWCA Employment Advisor. She participated in an evaluation of her skills and work values, and was provided support and guidance from the YWCA. After receiving information on soft skills, basic education, and English speaking classes, Hilaria is now employed as a bakery assistant. She continues to learn at her job through multitasking and mathematic measures while earning a living wage to support her family.

Her children are flourishing too as a result of their participation in the YWCA early education and afterschool programs. And, both children can now continue their learning at home on the computer Hilaria was able to buy with income from her new job.




