Summary

David Driapsa is a creative and technical landscape architect, a Fellow of the American Society of Landscape Architects, and a cultural landscape historian conducting field research, evaluating archival records, interviewing informants, drawing, and writing to document and preserve American landscape heritage.

Raised in a rural ethnic folk community in Appalachian Ohio, David observed his grand-parents helping neighbors prepare for U. S. citizenship, and entered a life of public service and leadership himself, first as high school senior class president. In his youth, David enjoyed farming, exploring the beautiful Paint Valley, and particularly the training received under guidance of his artisan father restoring antebellum mansions of the region. David completed an apprenticeship as a carpenter in the building arts before entering college.

Inspired by the geometrical earthworks in this ancient Hopewell heartland – such as Seip Earthworks – now up for UNESCO World Heritage nomination, and Great Serpent effigy mound, David studied art, graduating from the Ohio State University with a degree in landscape architecture, minoring in planning. He interned in the Division of Natural Areas and Preserves of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. A memorable conversation with Cultural Anthropologist John Brinkerhoff Jackson fired his interest in vernacular landscapes, eventually drawing him away from a Fortune 500 corporate practice in Westinghouse Electric Corporation master planning the community of Pelican Bay (where I reviewed architecture and landscape applications to conform with the upscale community. Pelican Bay received the community of the year award from the Urban Land Institute) to University of Arizona on a scholarship and a research-assistantship to academic mentor Dr. Ervin H. Zube and an intensive study of cultural landscapes. For his thesis, David wrote a historical narrative of four-centuries of landscape conservation and development in the village of Chimayo, New Mexico. Using field surveying, historical maps and aerial photographs, David analyzed twentieth century landscape change. Administering oral histories using Thematic Apperception Tests, he identified long-obscured family plazas and through his writing ignited local interest that initiated community historic preservation planning.

Upon receiving the master's degree, founded his practice at Naples, one of the most beautifully gardenized small cities in the United States, where his designs exhibit traditional craftsmanship constructed by artisans. His career ambitions led him to serve as National Coordinator leading the American Society of Landscape Architects tripartite mission with the National Park Service and the Library of Congress to establish the Historic American Landscapes Survey. David recruited and trained a nationwide corps of volunteers to record historic landscapes, leading the program to unprecedented success, resulting in hundreds of new entries into the Library of Congress HABS/HAER/HALS Collections.

In a long collaboration that continues with the National Park Service Heritage Documentation Programs as a preservation landscape architect, David was guided by HALS Chief Paul Dolinsky in attaining expertise in Section 106 documentation for historic landscape mitigation. A tour of duty at Voyageurs National Park amplified his acumen for sound preservation planning. Partnering in projects with Debbie Dietrich-Smith at the National Center for Preservation Technology & Training refined his field- and archival-research skills, learning LiDAR scanning technology and landscape history documentation methods advocated by the National Olmsted Center.

Semi-retirement has enabled David to focus on writing full-time, consulting when opportunity arises, and building state and national alliances that continue his advocacy for heritage landscape preservation.

David is partially disabled, though capable of performing the duties required of the design review board.

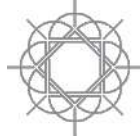

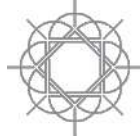
