RI COUNCIL ON RESOLUTIONS APPROVE HISTORIC ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING RESOLUTION

A historic vote was taken on November 1st, 2021, by the RI Council on Resolutions. Please see below the RI Council on Resolutions approved resolution submitted by IA District 6000.

Just over a year ago, this resolution was drafted and submitted to District 6000 by Dr. George Belitsos, Rotary Club of Ames and vice-chair of RAGAS.

Subsequently, the district resolution was voted on by all 67 District 6000 Clubs. Early this year the full Board of Directors of District 6000 approved and submitted the resolution to the RI Council on Resolutions.



On November 1, 2021, Resolution 21R-28 (proposed by District 6000 USA) passed the RI Council on Resolutions by a margin of 318 in favor and 151 in opposition.

This resolution is now headed to the RI Board of Directors for their April 2022 meeting. If this resolution is approved by the RI Board of Directors, it will be a major step forward in efforts to engage Rotary Clubs worldwide in the fight against human trafficking/modern slavery.

If the RI Board of Directors approves the resolution, it will be only the second time that the RI Board of Directors has made a written public policy stand in support of Rotary human trafficking/modern slavery engagement. The first such policy statement took place in 2013 when Mark Little of the United Kingdom founded the Rotary Action Group Against Slavery upon the approval of the RI Board of Directors.



RAGAS believes that Rotary is uniquely positioned to end human trafficking through its ability to pull communities together for a common humanitarian purpose.

RAGAS global chair, Dave McCleary is working hard to educate and inform the RI Board of Directors about this growing crime against humanity and thereby the importance of RI adopting resolution 21R-28, which can be found [here](#) in its entirety.



PROTECTING OUR CHILDREN

January is National Human Trafficking Prevention Month in America, dedicating the month to raising awareness about the different forms of human trafficking and educating people about this crime. Human Trafficking is a crime in which force, fraud or coercion is used to compel a person to perform labor or commercial sex. Victims are held captive through threat, often beaten or drugged into submission. The U.S. State Department reports that California is one of the top three states of reported cases of human trafficking and that San Diego, Los Angeles and San Francisco are three of the 10 highest child sex trafficking regions in the entire country. Seventy percent of victims are from our most vulnerable populations. The remaining thirty percent are from intact families, lured in through social media and the internet. All of our children can be targets. California Rotarians are dedicated to fighting this horrific crime!

TRAGAST PREVENTION TRAINING

Thailand RAGAS Team (TRAGAST) is working with Dr. Sombat Tapanya and his Peace Culture Foundation to give training designed to prevent children from being trapped in sex human trafficking.

Great support has been provided by Rotary Club Henry the Lion in Germany.

On 30 and 31 October a two-day online seminar was presented to 50 participants including school administrators, Chiang Mai University psychology students, teachers, law enforcement and an attorney.

Their "homework" assignment is to create a program that will contribute to the prevention of child human trafficking. Seminars are also being conducted on 21 and 28 November. Previous trainings were conducted in May and July.

Peace Culture Foundation is working with psychology majors at Chiang Mai University. Topics covered include bullying, sexual violence, awareness of pedophiles and sociopaths. Over 120 school officials have been reached and more training is being planned.

The newly announced RAGAS Community Awareness & Prevention Education (CAPE) program is being studied and will certainly improve our ability to Community Awareness and Prevention Work in The Thailand region.

RCEHT/TRAGAST LIBRARIES

HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND SLAVERY IN THAILAND

Anti-human trafficking and slavery is a major focus of Rotary. It is recognized as the major human disaster of our times. As polio nears eradication, the focus is centering on human trafficking and slavery, particularly as it applies to children.

Polio ravages the body but trafficking and slavery ravages both the body and the soul. We can and must put an end to this horrific crippling disease. If we do not act decisively, we will be complacent in increasing the profits of the traffickers and destroying the lives of the victims.

Here are some facts that may surprise many of you.

- Human trafficking and slavery are not "nice". They comprise an insidious, evil, and nasty business.
- Every country in the world has human trafficking and slavery. Some people are used for sex and others as cheap labor in sweat shops. All are victims.
- There are 40,000,000 slaves in the world today, more than at any other time in history. (As reported in 2016)
- Human trafficking is the 2nd largest business in the world, second only to illicit drugs. Often the two overlap.
- The poor and disenfranchised are the most vulnerable, but trafficking does not discriminate on the basis of education, income, race, religion or age. Anyone may be ensnared.
- The cost of a slave today as compared to that of a slave in the US when slavery was legal, is vastly different. Then, the cost of a slave was approximately the equivalent of \$40,000.00. A slave was valuable property and worth keeping healthy.



- Today, a person can be purchased for next to nothing and is thus disposable. If one becomes ill, so what, he or she is easily replaceable. Those on fishing boats may be simply thrown overboard.
- Disasters such as earthquakes, fires, floods etc. always increase the availability of victims.
- The current Covid pandemic definitely has increased trafficking. Children are often separated from their parents and families during disasters and thus more vulnerable.
- The disenfranchised and those lacking Thai ID are natural targets as they have limited resources for employment and often desperate for work.
- Thailand, because of its location, is a natural hub for trafficking.
- Traffickers may be strangers, teachers and even family members.



We, in Thailand, have the opportunity of establishing a program to attack the problem. What will we do and how will we do it? Education of children as well as adults, is the key.

It will involve education departments and NGOs from Thailand, Laos, Cambodia and Myanmar. We will work through education departments to train teachers about trafficking. They in turn will teach children how to avoid situations where they are vulnerable to traffickers, to recognize the warning signs and what to do if approached by possible traffickers.

The NGOs will assist in the training and in providing expertise and materials for workshops. We must involve leaders in all the Tribal communities as they often have many undocumented victims.

This process must begin when children are fairly young as, unfortunately, the young are the least able to protect themselves and often, especially desirable to those seeking children for sex.
