Broadway Reopening Plans

On June 1st, our Bishop released guidance on how we can worship together again in a Healthy and Safe manner. Relying on this guidance and the support of our superintendent, the Reopening Task Force is currently reviewing this guidance and the options of opening under various protective standards. These standards are set with the expectation to protect not only ourselves but also our fellow church members, families and other loved ones and we are excited at the prospect of reopening when it is safe to do so. We do not yet have a specific date but will communicate that as soon as we are able.

We wanted to share a high level summary of the Bishop's guidance as best quoted from our Superintendent Jason Gattis. "Before any church can move to an in-person service, a plan is to be submitted for approval to the district office which will need to contain the guidelines provided by the Center for Disease Control regarding social distancing and sanitization. Some other initial items that need to be included are:

- Usage of face coverings at all times.
- Sanitization protocols after each gathering.
- Process to document everyone in attendance.
- Social Distancing of family units (6 feet).
- No congregational singing.
- Encouragement of people to remain home if symptomatic or fall under the vulnerable category.

Some of these temporary changes will be a big change for our congregation. However, with the support of our fellow church attendees and our community, we are positive about our outlook of being able to worship together in a shared space once it is safe to do so while also maintaining the options to keep worship online to accommodate attendees regardless of their access or locations.

Over the next several weeks, our team will be reaching out to solicit your opinions on our reopening plans to ensure that we are fully weighting our options as a church family and our comfort level in returning to a share space environment.

We look forward to continuing to rejoice with you either from across the pew or in spirit.

Church Staff Changes

Effective July 1, 2020, Jennifer McIntyre, who is currently Director of Children's Ministries and Communications Coordinator, will step down from the Director of Children's Ministries position but will retain her Communications Coordinator position. Salvation Army Lunch Program Receives Grant

The Salvation Army Friday lunch program hosted by Broadway recently received \$5000 from the Holston Foundation to advance its work in serving the homeless and marginalized in our community. The lunch program continues uninterrupted during the COVID-19 pandemic. Food is prepared in the church kitchen and now is transported to the Blount County Library parking lot where clients gather every Friday. Last year, over 8000 lunches were served, utilizing over 2300 hours of volunteer service. In addition to lunch and fellowship, clients receive help with housing, car repair, government benefits, non-government aid, clothing, funeral services, and other types of support. Now over four years old, this partnership between our church and the Salvation Army continues to grow and serve our neighbors in many beneficial ways.
