Hope Does Not Disappoint

I just got back from a mission trip to Zimbabwe and Liberia. In Zimbabwe, our team visited my village and took part in the dedication of a new church building at my home church, Dzobo United Methodist Church. Zimbabwe is facing a severe drought, and my village has been heavily affected. The village elders and my family informed me that no one harvested anything, not even a single grain, as the river and streams that flow through the village had all dried up.

During our visit to Liberia, we visited economically depressed communities where we refrained from taking pictures. At one school, we provided 15 food buckets and a few backpacks, but the overwhelming need in the community made us feel like we weren't making much of a difference. It reminded me of Corbett & Fikkert's book *When Helping Hurts*, but I realized that our presence and gifts were not causing harm. Our purpose in Liberia and Zimbabwe was to establish meaningful relationships.

In Liberia and Zimbabwe, we were welcomed with great joy. The food buckets and backpacks brought joy not because they solved the economic challenges or eradicated the effects of drought in those communities but because they represented hope. One evening, after an exhausting day, I was reading Romans 5, and Verse 5 caught my attention. And hope does not put us to shame because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us (Rom. 5:5).

I was reminded that hope, rooted in God's love, does not disappoint or shame us. God's love is not theoretical or abstract but is tangibly poured into our hearts. This love is not just a feeling; it's a force that inspires hope. And hope, in turn, empowers us to face life's challenges with resilience and confidence. Our hope is grounded in God's unwavering love rather than human emotions or circumstances. That evening, I prayed for and thanked the people of the Holston Conference for allowing God to pour God's love into their hearts and bless the people in Liberia and Zimbabwe. God's love is the source of our hope to do more in the coming year. Thank you.
