Airliners International 2026 Denver Postcards, Labels and Memorabilia Display Guide

The Airliners International 2026 Denver show expands the opportunity to exhibit displays of airline memorabilia. You can now display not only favorite postcards, but also labels or other airline memorabilia.

Each person submitting a display will receive a complimentary gift of a postcard and a separate bookmark, each featuring Denver Stapleton Int'l Airport and the wonderful artwork of Chris Bidlack of jetageart.com.

Any collector who registers for Airliners International 2026 DEN may submit up to three airline or airport memorabilia displays to highlight our airline enthusiast hobby. Your display(s) may be newly prepared or even one previously submitted to an Airliners International show.

<u>Types of Displays</u>. Each display should be based on one of the following categories involving commercial aviation:

- * Airline
- * Aircraft Type
- * Airport
- * Special Theme

Examples of possible subjects in the above categories: *Airline* (United Airlines postcards or labels); *Aircraft Type* (Postcards, timetable covers or the backs of playing cards, showing Boeing 747s); *Airport* (Postcards of Denver airports); *Special Theme* (Postcards, labels or timetable covers of airlines serving Denver airports); Airline art postcards; Advertising postcards of European airlines; Aircraft interiors; Airline flight attendants; Covers of brochures on Denver airports; 'My favorite airline (or airport) memorabilia items and why they're my favorites'.

All entries should consist of printed scans or photocopies of items from your own collection, which should be in the same color (or black and white) as the original. It's also desirable to add an historical perspective to your display (for example, descriptive text, dates or publisher data). You can also combine different types of memorabilia.

Place your name on the front of your display(s).

By submitting one or more displays you consent to their being photographed, to having the photos shown at the WAHS banquet at AI 2026, and to the publication of such photographs in the online websites of the World Airline Historical Society and Airliners International.

<u>Placement of Your Displays in the Display Area and Their Handling.</u> Please bring your display to AI 2026 and give it to the Memorabilia Display Coordinator (Marvin Goldman) or to one of the coordinators of the Display

Room (David Grandy or Ken Miller) who will then place it in the Display Area. Each display will be shown in the Display Area as soon as it is received and the area is open for viewing.

Please note that, although AI 2026 and its representatives will exercise reasonable efforts to safeguard your display, AI 2026 and its representatives cannot guarantee the displays against damage, loss or theft, and they will not be liable therefor.

You are encouraged to leave your display(s) in the Display Area for others to see during the balance of AI 2026. This is not a requirement, however, and if you desire to remove your display prior to the end of AI 2026, you may do so.
