



Canmore demographics [2014]

Permanent population [77%]:

- $\frac{1}{4}$ are young – children/teen/young adult. 16% under age 15 and 9% between 15 and 24.
- Roughly half are working age. 48% between ages 25 -54. 15% are between 55 - 64 [so young retirees or older workers]
- Senior population is small. Only 12% are over 65 years old.
- 73% are in the work force. 18% retired.
- 92% speak English at home. 8% speak another language at home.
- 60% own. 35% rent.
- 32% have been resident for 5 years or less

Thinking that Ralph Connor Church is most likely to be a church home for the permanent resident population [above], how does the church's current population compare to the over-all community?

Non-permanent population [23%] is fairly similar

- $\frac{1}{4}$ are young – children/teen/young adult. 14% under 15 and 11% between 15 and 24
- 37% are working age. 24% are between 55 and 64 [young retirees or older workers]
- Senior population is similarly small. 15% are 65+
- 63% are in the work force. 23% are retired.
- 94% speak English at home. 6% speak another language at home.

Housing types [59% are occupied by permanent residents, 31% non-permanent]

- Single detached 38%
- Apartment 23%
- Townhouse 22%
- Duplex 9%
- Granny suite [e.g. basement] 3%
- Mobile home 2%
- Other 2%
